Engene L. Patton and family of Burbank, Calif., and Ray Hoover of Ventura, Calif., are visitors at Idleld.

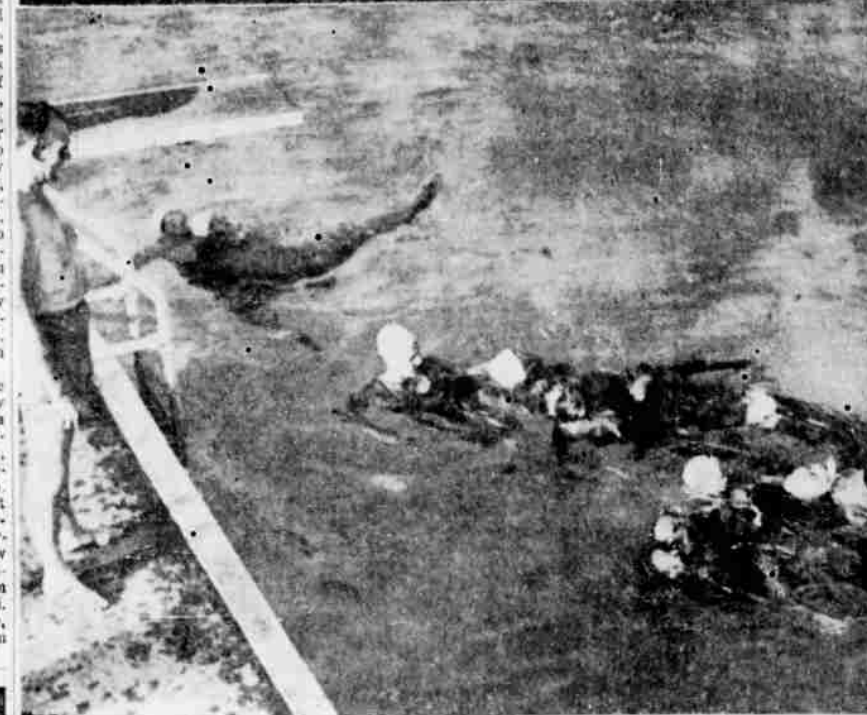
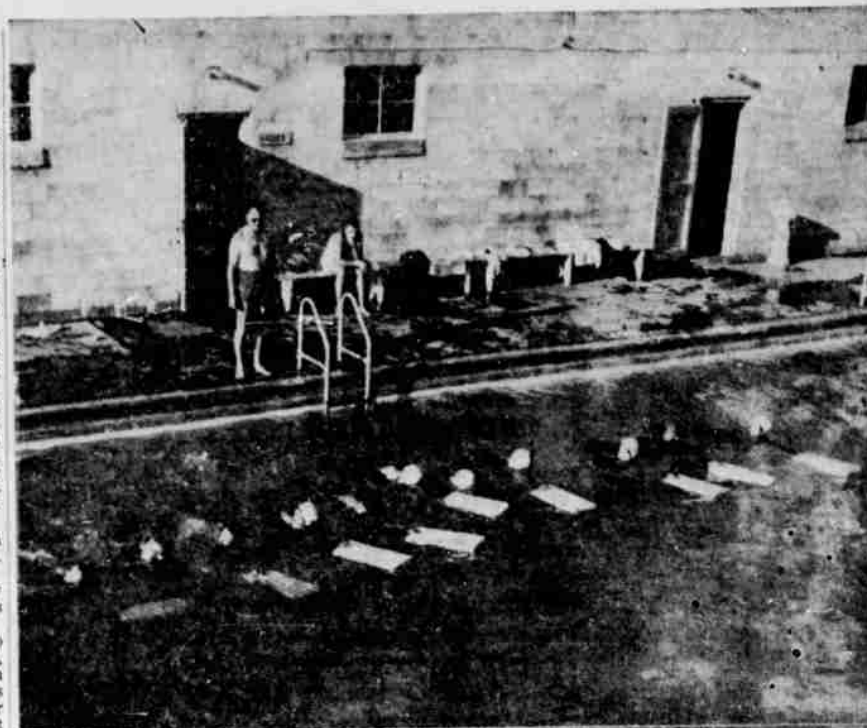

Misplaced Still Proves Costly

WASHINGTON — (AP) — Advice to moonshiners: when setting up a still on a stranger's property make sure that he isn't an employee of the Treasury department.

That important little point was overlooked in establishing a sizeable moonshining operation on some property 12 miles from Washington, in adjoining Prince Georges county, Md.

The property is owned by Everett Lunsford, a treasury man, who has been having some problems with his boundary lines. Lunsford was checking the lines late Sunday when he stumbled over the squatter still hidden in a wooded ravine.

He passed the word along to officers of another treasury organization, the internal revenue bureau's alcohol tax unit, which was on moonshining as a form of evasion of liquor taxes and distilling regulations.

Mariner Makes Second Solo Atlantic Crossing

PLYMOUTH, Eng. — (AP) — Edward Allcard has completed his second crossing of the Atlantic today in a 34-foot yawl. He did it alone, except for the stretch between the Azores and Lisbon, when he had a pretty young poetess aboard as a stowaway.

Allcard, 35, a London naval architect, sailed his tiny ship "Templest" into harbor to end an 11-month trip across the Atlantic from New York. He had made his first 5,000-mile crossing from Gibraltar to New York in 1948.

When Allcard left the Azores on this second crossing, he found 23-year-old Ottilio Frayao, a Portuguese poetess, had stowed away. He put her off at Lisbon.

Western Union Wage Hike Okayed By Employees

WASHINGTON — (AP) — Western Union company employees have voted to accept a company offer of a 17 cents-an-hour wage boost. Some 35,000 employees are involved. They had planned to go on strike July 2, but called it off to consider the company's offer. In addition, 8,000 messengers will get an immediate pay hike of 7 1/2 cents, followed by 2 1/2 cents more on Sept. 1.

Messengers now receive 75 cents an hour. Adult employees average \$1.27 an hour.

The company has estimated the wage boost will cost it \$12,500,000 a year. It has asked for an increase in rates.

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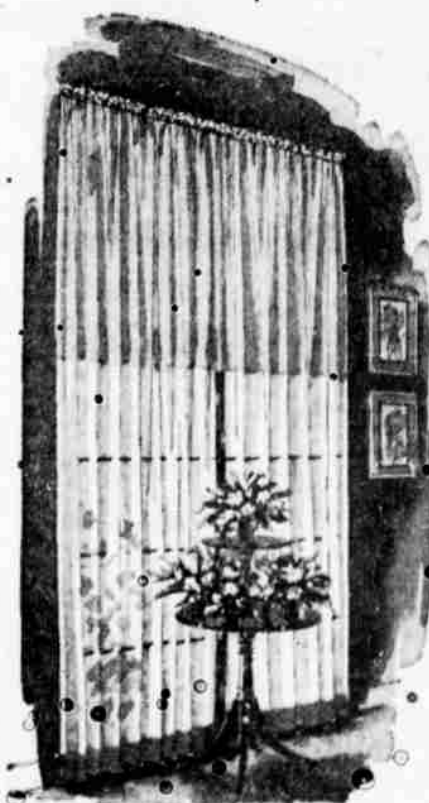
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
