

Economist Hits Defense Idea In Price Program

WASHINGTON - (P) - An economics professor urged Congress to kill a bill to set up "good faith" as a defense against price discrim-

Dr. Vernon A. Mund, Seattle, Oniversity of Washington professor, testified at a senate, small business committee hearing that the effects of a seller's behavior is the only way to determine price discrimination discrimination.

"His 'intent' or 'motive' is profit
— and this motive is neither one of
'good faith' or 'bad faith' — it is
a commercial fact," he said.

a commercial fact," he said.

The bill would establish "good faith" as a defense for a seller in meeting a low price of a competitor. The bill provides that the seller would not be deemed to have acted in good faith "if he knew or should have known that the lower price" was unlawful.
