Spending Plans Dim Hopes Of Cut In Tax Hike Bill

WASHINGTON — (AP) — Senator Byrd (D-Va.) indicates that government spending plans for next year have dimmed his hopes the Senate can trim the \$7,200,000,000 tax hike passed by the House.

Byrd also said he does not see where Congress could find the new taxes to balance the \$85,000,000,000 budget proposed for the year starting next July 1.

Byrd said it would be virtually impossible to balance an \$85,000,000,000 budget. To do so, he said, would mean going into some highly unpopular tax field such as a transactions levy. This would be worse than a sales tax, he said, since it would be applied at each

stage in the manufacture of a product. The Virginia senator did not shut the door to a reduction in the house tax bill, however. If \$4,000,000,000 to \$5,000,000,000 can be cut off this year's budget, he said, the tax bite can be reduced.

Byrd took issue with secretary of the treasury Snyder on the question of how much taxation the nation's economy can stand. Snyder submitted data on this point to the senate finance committee in response to a series of questions by Byrd.

The secretary said federal, state and local taxes now consume 23 percent of national income. The figure would rise to 29.8 percent under the house tax bill and 31.2 percent under the \$10,000,000,000 increase sought by the administration, he added.

Byrd said the 31.2 percent figure was "right at the danger point" beyond which total taxes should not go.

Snyder said, however, that proposed spending this year is "well within the capacity of our economy to bear and is substantially below any danger line that might mean an impairment of the reproduction efforts of our economy."
