### Umpqua Indians Seek Pay For Timber Lands

WASHINGTON — (AP) — Congress is asked to permit three Oregon Indian tribes to bill the government for timber lands which they claimed as ancestral property.

L. A. Gravelle of Washington, attorney for the Indians, told a house interior subcommittee that the federal government owes the Coos Bay, Umpqua and Siuslaw tribes for some of the nation's best Douglas fir lands.

He urged approval of a bill by Rep. Ellsworth (R-Ore), to permit the tribes to file claims with the Indian claims commission.

He said the government is paying other tribes for lands taken from them, but a court decision bars payment for 1,565,819 acres claimed by the three tribes.
