

SALEM — (AP) — The state board of control has fixed \$67 a month as the top charge for care of patients at the state hospitals at Pendleton and Salem, and at the Fairview home for feeble-minded persons in Salem.

For many years, the maximum charge has been \$25 a month. But the recent legislature told the board to fix the maximum at the actual cost of the care of patients. The charge is made against the patients or relatives who can afford to pay.

About 25 percent of the patients pay something, amounting to \$400,000 a year.

The board said the monthly cost of caring for each patient at the three institutions is: Oregon State hospital, \$62.79; Eastern Oregon State hospital, \$68.03; and Fairview home, \$75.31.

The board asked the state retirement board to continue for another year the employment of Dr. Grover C. Bellinger as superintendent of the state tuberculosis hospital. He has reached the retirement age.

Cold Reception Given Bill Of Rights

MADISON, Wis. — (AP) — The refusal of 111 persons, out of 112 asked, to sign a "petition" containing quotations from the Declaration of Independence was described today by a reporter for the Madison Capital Times.

The incident, which occurred here on the Fourth of July, was cited by President Truman today in a Detroit speech as illustrative of the effects of "all these lies, and smears and fear campaigns."

President Truman said the refusal of signatures indicated that the persons approached were afraid the petition was "some kind of a subversive document, and that they would lose their jobs or be called Communists."

John Hunter, Madison Capital Times reporter, said that as an assignment for his paper he took the printed petitions to Vilas park on July 4.

Hunter said the idea behind the petition was to "find out if McCarthyism had made the people so afraid that they would not sign a patriotic document." The newspaper, he said, had reference to the charges by Senator McCarthy (R-Wis.) of Communist influences in government.

The petitions, Hunter explained, were headed "preamble to the Declaration of Independence and the Bill of Rights." He added that the ten constitutional amendments, known as the bill of rights and the 15th amendment to the constitution were included.

Hunter said that during the same afternoon the Madison chapter of the American Peace Crusade was circulating mimeographed pamphlets asking for removal of American troops in Korea and asking Congress to make no more laws "taxing the working man to pay for a rich man's war in Korea."

Hunter's story in the July 5 issue of the Capital Times said "several" persons who had been asked to sign his petitions "mistook" it for the Peace Crusade pamphlet.

The Berliner Zeitung complained that "conspicuously bare" were the churches and administrative offices of the Evangelical church, East Germany's largest denomination.

The newspaper warned the churches that their "negligence" was being noted and "could easily be repaired."

Churches Ignore East Berlin Red Youth Festival

BERLIN — (AP) — East Berlin's Communist press accuses the churches and various individual citizens of failing to support the big Red world youth festival opening Sunday in the Russian sector of the city.

The press criticism contained pointed warnings that the churches were expected, at least, to hang out flags to welcome the Communist youth which is streaming into Berlin from all points of the compass.

Laggard citizens were reminded that every resident of East Berlin was expected not only to decorate his house but to provide as much space as possible for quartering the 2,000,000 delegates expected for the two-week festival.

Piling that many visitors into crowded and badly-battered East Berlin is the biggest task of its kind ever undertaken here.

The communist party organ, Neues Deutschland, said so far, after weeks of effort, quarters had been arranged for about 685,000 visitors. Of these 100,000 are to be lodged with families and the remainder in "mass quarters"—schools and other public buildings, stadiums and tent cities.

Thousands of workers, laboring over-time and Sundays, have already transformed much of East Berlin into a sea of flags and posters honoring Stalin and other leaders of the Communist world.
