and Door Workers union (CIO) at the council's convention here. Floyd Carr, also of Olympia, was renominated without opposition for secretary were Gordon Johnson of Spanaway, Wash., and W. W. Smith of Eugene, Ore.

The 75 delegates chose Bellingham for their convention next year. The union's membership will select their officers in a referendum election by mail within 40 days. The delegates went on record as favoring negotiations with operators for general improvements in existing wage contracts.

Duffy was dean of Klamath reservation foresters with 22 years' service.
