O'Dwyer Denies Money Transfer

MEXICO CITY — (AP) — U. S. Ambassador William O'Dwyer has branded as "an abominable lie" a report that \$1,000,000 had been transferred to his bank account earlier this year.

In a statement issued here, the former New York mayor denounced as "a cowardly and contemptible smear" the report which he said "appears to have emanated from the senate crime investigating committee."

The New York Daily News published a dispatch from Washington Wednesday saying the senate committee was investigating a \$1,000,000 letter of credit "reportedly transferred from Mexico to a Manhattan bank for the account of Ambassador William O'Dwyer a few days before the New York's former mayor testified before the committee last March."

The dispatch quoted an informed source as saying the letter of

credit "was mysteriously cancelled five days after," but that the bank reported the transfer of funds "because of the size of the transaction and the coincidence in timing."

New Bombers To Cost U.S. Taxpayers Millions

WASHINGTON — (AP) — The air force's first four B-52 intercontinental bombers will cost American taxpayers \$21,354,211 each — thirty-five times the cost of the first B-17's some 11 years ago.

This insight into the high cost of military preparedness was disclosed by air force officials in recent budget hearings before the house military appropriations subcommittee.

The B-52's intricate bomb sights alone will cost more than \$250,000 each — about 100 times the price of the famed World War Two Norden bomb sight.

The first B-52 is expected to be ready for test flight later this year. It will have eight jet engines and will climb to more than 50,000 feet.

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
