New 4-H Awards System For Swine At State Fair

A new awards system for 4-H swine exhibitors at the state fair has been announced by Cal Moonroe, state 4-H agent at Oregon State college.

The Oregon Purebred Swine Breeders association, headed by George Kraus of Silverton, will continue to award purebred weaner gilts to the top 4-H swine exhibitors of each breed. However, this year the winners will be chosen on the basis of their exhibits, herdsman's showmanship, record books, 4-H citizenship and interviews.

Previously the gilts were presented to the 4-H'ers who showed the champion market hogs.

Monroe points out that any 4-H pig club member who exhibits at the state fair may compete for these awards.

John Haase and Son, Cornelius, will award the Duroc gilt. Alton Marshall, Mulino, will award the Chester White; A. T. Lathrop, Central Point, the Berkshire; John T. Wavra, Woodburn, the Yorkshire; and Harold W. Schmidt, Newberg, the Hereford gilt. A Spotted Poland China and a Hampshire gilt will also be awarded.

Harvest Demands Will Cut Down Unemployment

Unemployment increased slightly through the latter weeks of July but new harvest demands, mainly in western Oregon bean fields, will cut down the number of job seekers by mid-August to lowest levels since the end of the war, according to reports from 29 local offices of the State Unemployment compensation commission.

About 13,500 available men and women were without work August 1 as compared with 12,944 last month and 20,980 a year ago. The post-war low came October 1 last with 12,418 persons hunting jobs.

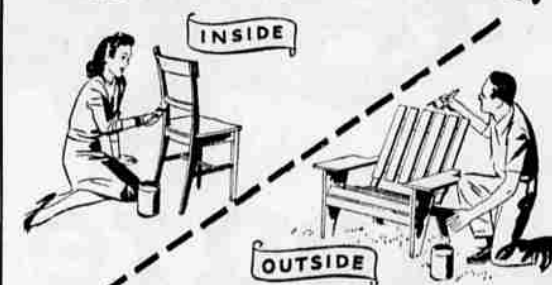

Sabotage Theory Advanced In Crash Of Airlift Plane

VANCOUVER — (CP) — The Vancouver Sun says that sabotage looms as a possible explanation for the crash of a Tokyo airlift plane 14 days ago.

The plane with 38 aboard disappeared off Cape Spencer, Alaska, while enroute from Vancouver to Tokyo. It was operated by the Canadian Pacific Airlines.

The Sun said that officials of the airlines had ruled out the possibility of mechanical failure as responsible for its disappearance.

"R. C. M. P. and F. B. I. agents are standing by to inspect the wreckage, if, as and when, it is found," said the newspaper report.

Spokesman for the C. P. A. said there has never been a crash of a DC-4 — the type of plane used on the airlift — as a result of mechanical failure.

The Sun said it had learned that baggage of U. S. airmen aboard the plane had not been inspected.

"With this in view, officials are considering the possibility that a bomb or some other infernal device might have been concealed in the baggage."

R. C. M. P. headquarters here and in Ottawa declined to comment on the sabotage report.

Aboard the plane were seven Vancouver crew members, two Canadian navy men, three American civilians, three U. S. army officers and 23 American airmen.
