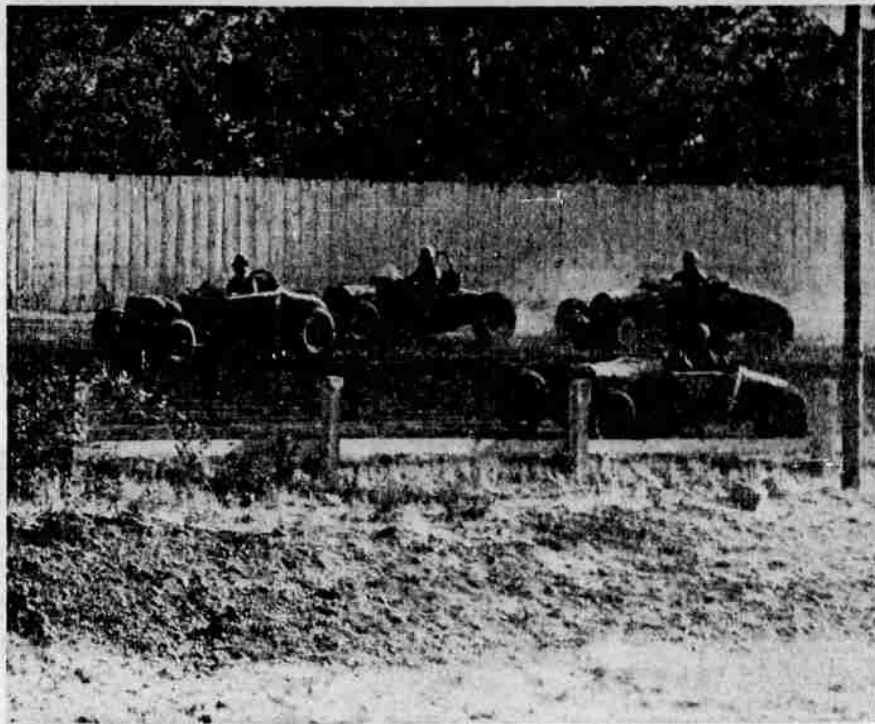

Slo-Mo-Shun Wins Title In Gold Cup Speedboat

SEATTLE — (AP) — A water-logging, almost-flying mahogany saucer fresh from the boat works ran away from America's finest speedboats Saturday to keep the Gold Cup in Seattle.

But the city's jubilation over the record-smashing triumph of Slo-Mo-Shun V was dulled when death closed its fist on another entry, the Quicksilver, early in the third and final heat, snuffing out two lives.

champion and sister of the new queen, the Slo-Mo-Shun IV, which finished third Saturday behind Horace Dodge's Hornet — another new boat, built on the Slo-Mo pattern.

With perfect timing, Fageol hit the starting line first on every heat and never trailed, his boat's 1,750-horsepower engine purring like 10,000 cats. Off and flying in the third heat, he had turned two laps when the Quicksilver came to grief. Lee Schoenith of Detroit, driving the Gale II, hit some floats and pulled up, afire for a brief moment. A bit of debris also gouged a hole high in the bow of the Hurricane II, but Stanley Dollar, Jr., kept the Los Angeles entry running.

At first the boats were flagged to proceed with caution and maintain position, but then were waved in when it was certain there were no survivors of the Quicksilver tragedy. Referee Mel Crook ruled standings at the end of the second heat, but awarded Slo-Mo-Shun V a bonus for best times in heat and race. The boat wound up with 1000 points — the highest possible. Hornet earned 600 points and Slo-Mo "fo" 450. Hurricane IV placed fourth with 296 points.

Patty Added To Davis Team

RYE, N. Y. — (AP) — Budge Patty of Los Angeles, 1950 Wimbledon champion, was added to the United States' Davis Cup team today for the American zone finals this weekend against Canada.

America's big one-two punch — Dick Savitt of Orange, N. J., and Tony Trabert of Cincinnati — along with national champion Art Larsen of San Leandro, Calif., will be other members of the squad that will begin a three-match series in Montreal Friday.

"We hope to make a Davis Cup doubles team out of Trabert and Patty," Frank Shields, non-playing captain of the U. S. forces said. "We tried Savitt with Trabert but it didn't work so well. We think Patty may be better."

Shields added that he didn't know how the singles tests would be assigned.

The United States gained a 5-0 rout over Japan while Canada was clinching its series with Cuba yesterday. In the final singles matches Herbie Flam of Los Angeles subdued Rolando Vega, 6-3, 6-3, 6-3, and Vic Seizas of Philadelphia trounced Mario Llamas, the Mexican champion, 6-3, 8-6, 6-1.

Haddock Topped By Champion Roy

Frenchy Roy kept a firm grip on his Pacific Coast junior heavyweight wrestling title by snagging two falls from challenger and former title holder Gentleman Dale Haddock Saturday night at the Roseburg armory.

In one of the finest cards ever staged here, Haddock took the first decision with two successive backbreakers. Roy surged back to hand Haddock some of his own medicine, a backbreaker and spine breaker, for the second fall. He quelled the Gentleman by taking the third fall with head scissors, a body slam and press.

The other two matches were as evenly chosen as any ever seen here. Two canny and catlike wrestlers, Jack Kiser, and George Strickland, divided two falls in the semi-final after some of the fastest action in months. It took Strickland just 25 seconds to incapacitate Kiser with a sensationally smooth abdominal stretch. They fought on even terms until only a minute and a half remained. Then Kiser tied up the match with a "skin the cat."

In the curtain raiser, headbutt artist, duus Jones, met jiu jitsu master, "Sneeze" Achlu, and together they got nowhere. The match ended in a no-fall draw.

Cary Middlecott Leads In Tam Golf Tournament

CHICAGO — (AP) — Cary Middlecott, hitting one of the hottest stretches of golf in his career, carried off top swag in the first phase of Tam O'Shanter's gold rush and now aims for \$12,500 in the "world" meet — the game's richest payoff.

The 30-year-old Memphis star, who forsook the practice of dentistry to carve a place on the tournament circuit, won Tam's all-American top prize of \$2,250 yesterday in a man-to-man battle with Fred Hawkins, 27-year-old pro from El Paso, Tex.

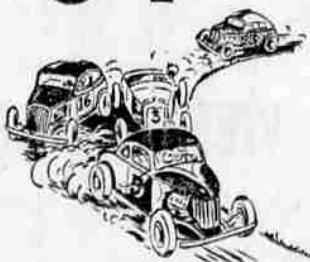

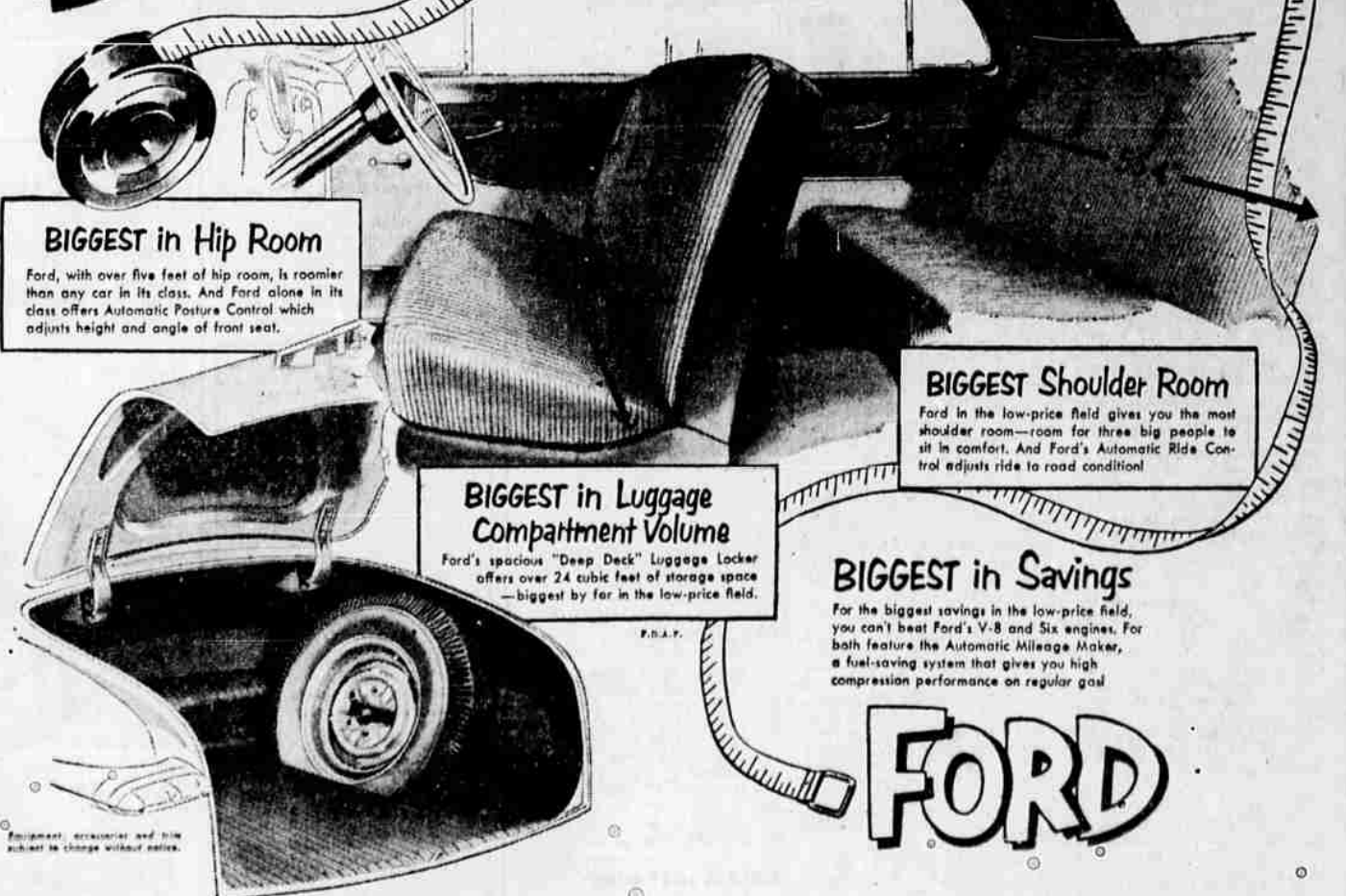
