Telephone Co. Begins New Move For Rates Boost

SALEM — (AP) — Pacific Telephone and Telegraph company has launched a new drive to gain a \$5,188,000 increase in Oregon telephone rates.

The company filed a new application for the rate increase with Oregon Public Utilities commissioner George H. Flagg and agreed to drop a circuit court suit which sought to overrule Flagg's rejection of a similar increase in April, 1950.

The company said the new increase would net the firm only \$2,500,000, the rest going to pay federal taxes.

"This repricing request," F. A. Dresslar, vice-president and general manager said, "is necessary to meet sharply mounting costs. Increases apply to both toll and exchange rates, and the public and semi-public coin box rate is raised from 5 cents to 10 cents per call."

"Today's application — the only one the company now has before the commissioner — brings up to date the company's urgent need for added revenues," Dresslar said.

The rate increases would affect all Oregon telephone users. In explaining the reasons for the increase, Dresslar noted, "it is a regrettable and incongruous situation, but for every dollar of wage increase brought about by the recent negotiations, approximately the same amount must be taken from telephone users for federal taxes."

Hearings will be held on the proposed rate increase in September.
