Pennsylvania Boy Wins Soapbox Race
AKRON, O. — (AP) — Tall, slender Darwin Cooper, 15, a shy boy who built his sleek black racer in the dining room of his home in Danville, Pa., is the hero of the Susquehanna valley today.
The black-browed lad rode to victory in the 14th All American Soapbox derby here yesterday to give Pennsylvania its first national champion in the history of the event.
The All-American champ, running under the colors of the Williamsport Sun - Gazette, defeated 140-winners from the U. S., Canada, Alaska and the U. S. zone of Germany.
Darwin's steelworker father, William, his mother Elizabeth, and a cousin, Donalder, who was second in last year's All-American

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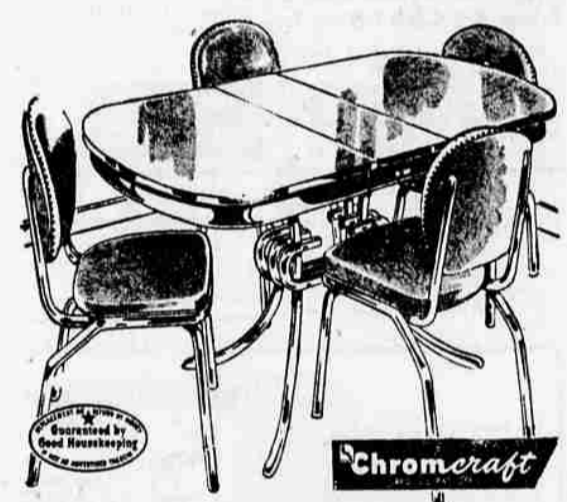
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Prices Show Increase

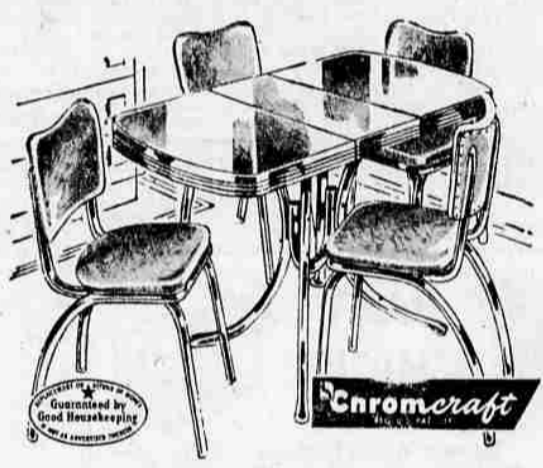

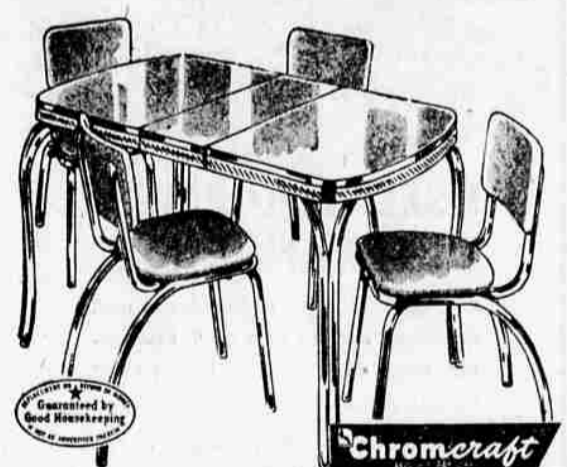

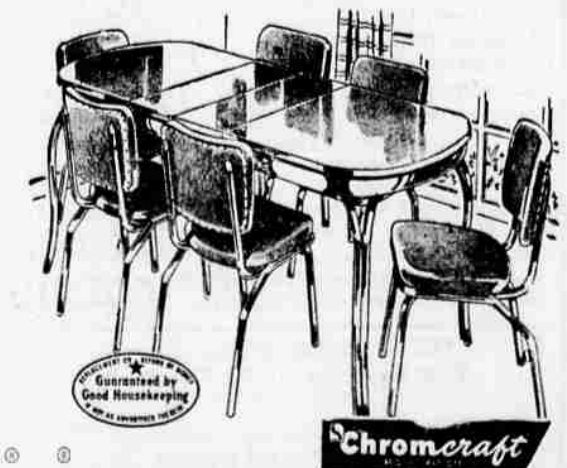
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
