

Douglas County Housing Authority Activities During Last Fiscal Year Highlighted By Project In Roseburg

High spot in activities of the Housing authority of Douglas county for the fiscal year, ended June 30, was the starting of construction of Rosewood homes in Roseburg, according to the annual report submitted by Executive Director H. L. Scofield.

The project consists of 30 duplexes and an administration-maintenance building. A total of ten bids was received, the contract going to Malarkey and Moore, Portland, on a low bid of \$404,500. The specifications call for ten months to finish the construction. However, on the construction progress schedule issued by the contractors they expect to have the work completed and buildings ready for occupancy by March 1, 1952, the report states.

Land has been purchased at Riddle for building eight units of public housing in that town. The architect's schedule calls for advertising for bids on Sept. 19, with 21 days for bidding.

The construction of eight units at Oakland was also planned to start this fall, but because of failure to procure satisfactory title to the proposed site, the acquisition of other property is now being arranged.

Repeated negotiations have failed to result in the purchase of a satisfactory site at Reedsport, where 15 units of public housing have been authorized.

The 100 units of war housing at Sutherlin are still being operated by the authority, as are the 40 units at Myrtle Creek. Because of the war emergency declared by President Truman, no change in the status of these units is yet in sight, Scofield's report says.

Scofield said that the individual cost of operating the war emergency houses at Sutherlin and Myrtle Creek has been approximately \$20.50, with water, light and garbage service provided. For the new low rent housing project at Roseburg, it is expected that the average cost of operation will be \$38.50, but this will include furnishing of space heat in addition to other services, and three percent retirement on the bond.

Catholic Work Grows In Nepal, In Ban Reversal

PORTLAND — (AP) — Archbishop Edward D. Howard, in an order made public Saturday, directed that after Sept. 1 no Catholic weddings be solemnized on Sunday in the archdiocese of Portland.

"A sense of the fitness of things," his order to parish priests said, "suggests that no social function, such as that which ordinarily takes place after a marriage, should be held on a Sunday or holy day of obligation."

Catholics should be married at a nuptial mass in their parish church, he said, and a nuptial mass is impossible on Sunday morning. Moreover a Sunday marriage interferes to some extent with religious services in the average parish, his order said, and hence is to be avoided.

On appeal to the chancery office, exceptions may be made in cases of "real necessity."

Visit To Hawaii Told Rotarians By J. A. Harding

J. A. Harding, owner of the Hotel Umquqa, described what he called a "very enjoyable" trip which he recently made to the Hawaiian Islands, Thursday noon at the Rotary club luncheon in the hotel.

The boat trip aboard the liner Laurine was one of the most interesting parts of the trip, he said. He called the islands a "melting pot of nationalities," but they had "really learned" how to get along with each other, he noted.

Harding showed a portion of the many color pictures which he snapped during his lengthy stay. The brilliantly colored, picturesque photographs were well-received by Rotarians.

Traffic in the city of Honolulu is handled "very well," said Harding, with fatalities held to a low figure. It is a prosperous city, he added.

Sugar is the leading industry in the islands, he stated, with pineapple and the tourist trade rating second and third in importance. More than 25,000 persons are employed there the year-round in the sugar industry, which last year sold more than a million tons. About 95 percent of the raw sugar is refined in California, he said.

More than 100,000 tourists visited the islands last year, Harding noted.

Stock Auction Boosted
Harding also commented on the auction in which 4-H and FFA youngsters will offer their stock for sale on Saturday, the final day of the Douglas county fair.

He agreed with Kenneth Ford, who mentioned the matter previously, that civic-minded individuals and firms should see to it that the youths receive an additional reward to supplement the mere market prices usually received for their stock in the auction.

A boy who last year received a calf donated by the hotel wanted to arrange a direct sale to him, said Harding, because some youths involved in last year's auction actually suffered losses in using that method.

Earlier, Ford declared that if we really want to help the youngsters in their stock raising, citizens of the community should make sure that prices are boosted enough over market prices to assure the youths of some reward for their labors. A round of applause greeted his statement.

Swim Challenge Issued
Gordon Carlson, representing the Junior chamber of commerce, directed a challenge from that organization to the Rotary club to produce a swimming relay team of four men to race the JCs in the water carnival this weekend.

He presented Earl Decker, attired in a striking green suit resembling long underwear and wearing flippers and goggles, who was identified as the JC anchor man for the relay. The Kiwanis and Lions clubs have also been challenged, he said.

After recalling past glories in athletic competition with city service clubs, Rotarians formed a four-man squad to carry the club's colors into the pool.

Labor Council Urges Bond Sale Speed Up

PORTLAND — (AP) — The Portland central labor council says it will ask the Oregon state board of control to speed up the sale of bonds to finance the World War Two veterans' bonus.

L. C. Swafford, council delegate, called for immediate call for bids. He said the bonds could have an offer for sale Aug. 3.

Stat officials have said that proposals to sell the bonds have not aroused much interest on the bond market.
