Jaycees Booted From Tournament In First Game By North Bend Team

The Junior chamber of commerce, representing the Twilight softball league of Roseburg, was booted in the first round of play in the district 6 tournament at Drain Monday night. The Sportsmen store of Oakridge won the state tournament berth.

Bennett Painters of North Bend dumped the Jaycees in the first game of the sudden death series, 11-7. Oakridge bounced North Bend in the finale, 4-2, in a nine-inning overtime tilt.

The North Bend hitters brought out their big guns to devastate the Jaycee pitching staff of Joe Dame and Bob Kidder. Fred Murray, Tom Stenger and Red Hodge of North Bend all collected homers. These home runs all came in a five-run flareup in the third inning that drove Dame from the mound to make way for Kidder.

The Jaycees were blanked through the first five innings, but broke loose for three tallies in the sixth. It appeared that the losers might get in the race in the seventh. Dick Nichols opened the frame with a homer and North Bend pitcher Harvey Wellsandt walked four men in a row. The threat died, however, when he struck out one man and forced two more to ground out.

The North Benders got off to a good start in the second game for the district 6 title. They pushed across two runs, but couldn't hold the margin. Oakridge scored one in the third and then tied the score at the end of the seventh. After a scoreless overtime eighth, Oakridge had two outs in the ninth when a single, balk, error and walk allowed two runs to score to cinch the contest.

Jinx No Bother To Champ Maxim

SUMMIT, N. J. — (AP) — Light Heavyweight Champion Joey Maxim says he's not worried over the title jinx that has hexed five boxing kings this year.

"Jinxes aren't going to help anybody in here Wednesday," said Maxim, who defends his crown against Irish Bobby Murphy in Madison Square Garden tomorrow night. "I'm more concerned about some of that rough stuff he likes to pull."

"If he pulls any dirty stuff on me, I'll give him some of it right back," said Joey who started to smoulder as he discussed the matter.

Maxim has been fighting pro close to 12 years and knows all the tricks.

"This is all or nothing with me," said Maxim. "I'm on the spot and I'll give it right back to him. Thumbs, if necessary. I don't ever start that kind of stuff but I'll protect myself."

Murphy, a fighter who bores in from the start and keeps throwing punches without a letup, was a burned up at the charges from the Maxim camp.

"I don't pull any of that sort of thing," said the socking San Diego sailor.

"They're just getting up an alibi," said Murphy. "Maxim can't take it in the body, and believe me, I'm going to belt him plenty there. As a matter of fact, I'm going to knock him out with a left hook to the body within seven rounds."

Murphy has looked real sharp in his workouts while Maxim hasn't been any ball of fire. As a result, the odds have switched and the challenger is now a 5 to 7 choice. When the match was signed, Maxim was installed as a 1 to 2 choice.

The 15-rounder figures to draw a crowd of from 9,000 to 10,000 and a gross gate of about \$60,000 at a \$15 top.

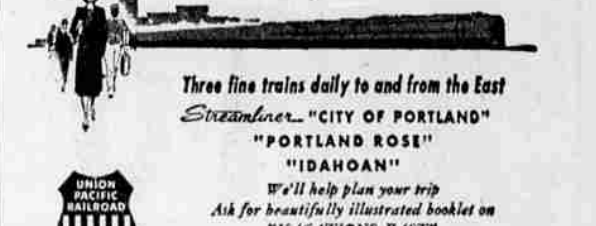
