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Smoking, Drinking Male Types Are Theorized

EDINBURGH, Scotland — (AP) — Stocky men smoke more than lean men and fat men are more often the ones who drink.

These theories were advanced by Dr. R. W. Parnell of the department of social medicine of Oxford university.

"In all behavior physique plays a large part," he told the British Association for the Advancement of Science.

Dr. Parnell reported on his research into the relationship between physique and work, play habits, illness and lawbreaking.

Dr. Parnell said total abstainers from alcohol are most often found among those of a light build.

"Indigestion is commonest in men dominantly muscular in build," he said. "It is commonest in the lean and muscular and less common in the fat and muscular. Very fat and very lanky men have indigestion much less often," he declared.

Persons suffering nervous tension in interviews or examinations,

he added, are more commonly the lean and muscular build.

Dr. Parnell even reached into a reformatory to make his comparisons. He contrasted the build of women university students with young women in a corrective institution.

He reported there is a tendency for young women delinquents to be stocky, but not necessarily short.

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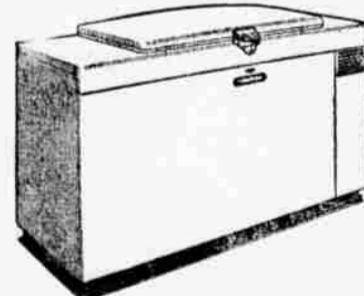


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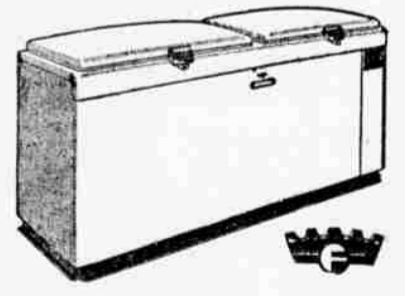
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
