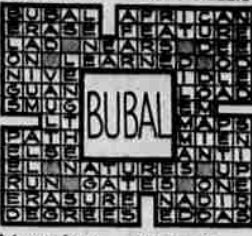

Spruce Budworm Aerial Spraying Proves Effective

PORTLAND — The million-acre 1951 aerial spraying program to eradicate the spruce budworm from a vast section of Oregon and Washington forests has been marked up as highly successful after extensive checks of budworm kill. R. L. Furniss, entomologist in charge of the Forest Insect Laboratory at Portland, reported today to the Spruce Budworm Action committee on the effectiveness of the 1951 spraying in Oregon and Washington.

A survey completed under Furniss' direction encompassed 35 miles of check lines in 72 different locations throughout the area sprayed and showed the average mortality of spruce budworm to be 98.6 percent. The same check lines were sampled both before and after spraying.

Furniss recapitulated along with his report of the 1951 spraying, the total control job accomplished thus far. He stated that a total of 2,141,000 acres in Oregon and Washington had been sprayed with DDT by airplane in 1949, 1950 and 1951. The spraying was done under the technical direction of the Forest Insect Laboratory and carried out under the administrative supervision of the U. S. Forest Service on 1,004,000 acres, the Oregon Board of Forestry on 1,127,000 acres, and on 10,000 acres by the Washington Division of Forestry.

This 2-million-acre plus job of forest insect control is the largest single attempt of man to control a destructive forest insect by aerial means in North America, Furniss stated. It cost about \$1.10 per acre and was financed jointly by private forest landowners, the states of Washington and Oregon and the federal government.

In order to determine if further control is necessary, 150 foresters and entomologists are now engaged in a detection survey, Furniss stated. This survey will be completed in another 30 days. Shortly thereafter the Spruce Budworm Action committee will meet to study the results of the survey and to determine whether further control is necessary.

Tacoma Police Shift Ordered In War On Vice

TACOMA — (AP) — Safety Commissioner James T. Kerr said he would not appoint a new chief of police today but a police captain said he was told Saturday by Commissioner Kerr that he would be acting chief.

Capt. Earl D. Cornelson, a police officer for 21 years, said at the police station that Kerr had phoned him Saturday and told him he would be acting chief.

Meanwhile, former chief Anthony M. Zatkovich, fired by the city council Friday and promptly assigned to the police morals squad by Commissioner Kerr, was to start his one-man "cleanup" of the city today.

Zatkovich announced Saturday that he would "close up the town," including church bingo and domino games. The two members of the morals squad as it existed prior to Friday were summarily dismissed by the council after the \$6,000 vice report characterized Tacoma as a "vice capital" in the northwest.

However, Commissioner Kerr was expected to appoint four more men to the morals squad today and, presumably, one of the new appointees will be named head of the squad, leaving Zatkovich just one of the squad.

Leave Germany, Order To American Attorney

FRANKFURT, Germany — (AP) — Frederick Wiehl, American attorney who defended former SS General Oswald Pohl, has been ordered to leave Germany at once U. S. high commission officials said.

Wiehl, an American citizen, is being expelled for his activities as person" these officials said.

The former New York lawyer came to Germany first in 1929 and since then has spent much time here.

Wiehl often spoke of his friendship with Pohl as he fought vainly to save the former SS general from the hangman last June 7.

But a high commission spokesman asserted that Wiehl was not being expelled for his activities as a defense lawyer for Pohl.

"He is an undesirable person and that is the sole reason for expelling him," he said.

He added that Wiehl made no attempt to oppose the order.
