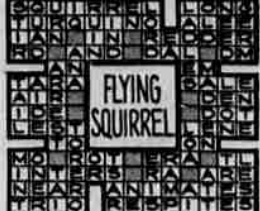

Richard Sands of Portland, son of Mr. and Mrs. Charles Sands, has been visiting his parents in Wilbur.

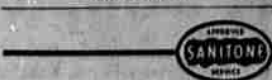
Russia Spurns Hearing On Baltic Area Claims

COPENHAGEN, Denmark — (AP) — Russia has rejected proposals that her disputed claim of control over 12 miles of territorial waters in the Baltic instead of the normal three be taken to the International Court of Justice.

Denmark and Sweden have protested the Russian extension of territorial waters along the long stretches of the Soviet-controlled Baltic states and East Germany. The two Scandinavian countries have claimed jurisdiction only over a three-mile stretch along their shores. They asked that the dispute be taken to the U. N. sponsored world court.

The dispute caused considerable anger when Danish and Swedish ships were seized by the Reds after they got within the 12-mile limit of the Soviet-held areas.

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
