BALTIMORE — (AP) — The world's champion lightning bug catcher was the pride of the neighborhood Saturday. Thirteen year-old Morgan Mallory Buchner Jr. had a \$10 prize to show for his summer's work—32,585 lightning bugs.

Of course he was assisted by a smoothly run organization. It consisted of his sister, Mary Louisa, and six neighborhood youngsters who combed the surrounding residential area each night to collect the bugs.

Johns Hopkins university stages the annual event. A university biologist uses the insects in a study to try to find out exactly what makes them light up.

Young Buchner has won the contest four years in a row.

INCOMES AVERAGE UP

WASHINGTON — (AP) — American income in 1950 averaged \$1,436 for every man, woman and child, according to the Commerce department.

This was a gain of \$116, or nine percent, over 1949 and was the highest dollar total in history, the department added in a report.

A 6.5 percent advance in the cost of living plus a rise in taxes cut down the net gain.
