

Eccentric Types

1. Eccentric personalities. These are comics whose very nature make them funny. The most notable are Jimmy Durante. Ed Wynn and Dagmar, all of whose attributes are well known and outstanding.

2. Specialty or tour de force comics. They can assume a variety of characters in different sketches and generally are as good as their material. Examples: Sid Caesar, Imogene Coca, Jackie Gleason.

3. Emcees or entertainers. These are the masters of timing and pacing who can do enough singing, dancing, acting and cutting up to get into every act. Examples: Milton Berle, Eddie Cantor.

4. Talking comics. These fellows, such as Arthur Godfrey.
