

Thos. J. McCarry Gets Promotion With S.P. Lines

Promotion of Thomas J. McCarry, assistant district freight and passenger agent, Southern Pacific company, Roseburg, to general agent of the railroad at Spokane effective immediately, was announced by F. C. Nelson, freight traffic manager, and J. H. Pruett Jr., general passenger agent, Portland, today.

He will be succeeded by Paul Carbon, who is being promoted from traveling freight and passenger agent, Spokane.

McCarry has made his headquarters in Roseburg since 1948,

coming here from position as city freight agent in Portland. He joined Southern Pacific in Vancouver, B. C., in 1936 and prior to his Roseburg assignment had been promoted through a number of positions in both the freight and passenger departments in Portland and Seattle offices of the company.

Carbon started with Southern Pacific in the general office of the freight department in Portland in 1936. In 1938 he was promoted to office manager of the Spokane office, then to city freight agent at Seattle. In 1942 he was inducted

into the armed forces where he served for four years during World War II. Upon his discharge in 1946 he was made traveling freight and passenger agent at Spokane.

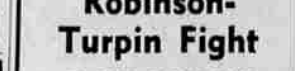

Rape Of Negro Woman Revealed

CARTHAGE, N. C. — (P) — News of a mass rape of a Negro woman by six white soldiers last month during joint army-air force maneuvers in this area, came to light here Monday.

Sheriff C. J. McDonald said the woman was attacked by the soldiers in the rear of an army truck during "exercise Southern Pines." He identified the woman as Lela Mae Arles, 30, of New York, wife of a Negro soldier and mother of two children.

News of the mass rape had been withheld at the request of army officials in the hope that the men would be identified and arrested, McDonald said. No arrests have been made to date.
