Oregon Ducks Lack Power For Tough 10-Tilt Season

EUGENE — (AP) — Len Casanova, the new football coach at Oregon, notes on western atmosphere and scenery.
This is just as well. It may be a great comfort to him in the coming months while the Oregon team undertakes a 10-game schedule.
Casanova, who quit at Pittsburg to get back to the west, inherited exactly four regulars and 11 reserves from a team that didn't win a coast conference game last year.
The result is that sophomores, up from the frosh team, and freshmen, who now are eligible for varsity play in the conference, make up the bulk of the squad.
Casanova, who quit at Pittsburg for this situation. One writer, however, cornered him, and demanded to know what Casanova thought of the squad.
He still didn't speak. Instead he pointed to a school patch on his jacket, Solid Green.
The former Santa Clara coach has a knack, though, of filling even the green players to overflowing with team spirit. If he can develop some line play to go with the spirit, he might even manage to win a game or two.
There is some backfield talent on hand. There's Tommy Edwards, a 165-pound seatback from Klamath Falls. Given a little blocking, he's as hard to catch as a flea on a fur rug.

At right half there is sprinter Bill Fell from Compton, Calif., who broke a leg and played only scant minutes last year, and Tom Lyon, Long Beach, Calif., back for another try after calls from the armed forces interrupted his 1948 and 1950 seasons.
In addition there's passing galore. The No. 1 thrower is Hal Dunham, Walla Walla, Wash., who developed fast in spring practice. He's backed by three proficient newcomers, sophomore Barney Holland, Coos Bay, and freshmen George Shaw, Portland, and Wally Russell, Eugene.
The problem is to get some protection in front of these players. In the line the only regulars are end Monte Brethauer, Portland; tackle Gerry Moshofsky, Beaverton, Ore., and center Dick Patrick, Vale, Ore. Brethauer is a fine pass-catching threat, but is slender and seldom used on defense.

NEW YORK — (AP) — Another million dollar fight production was in the making today — the Middleweight Champion Sugar Ray Robinson versus Rocky Graziano, the golden boy of the ring.
That's not expected to come off until next year, however, maybe February in Chicago. Randy Turpin, the strong 23-year-old Briton, will have to wait until June for another crack at the title he held for such a short time.
The \$240,000 Robinson got for his tenth round T.K.O. of Turpin Wednesday night makes about \$500,000 he has earned this year.
In the works now for Robinson is the Chicago battle with Rocky after the sellout crowd of 61,370 month or so later.
Any return with Randy will have to wait for June. And if they ever get together again it probably will be in London's White City stadium during derby week — late May or early June.
