

Attitude Of 'Beef, Metals' Near 'Deliberate Defiance'

NEW YORK —(AP)— Economic Stabilizer Eric Johnston says the attitude of "beef and metals" toward price controls is almost "deliberate defiance," and the government plans to crack down if the situation continues.

Johnston, former president of the U. S. chamber of commerce, made the statement in addressing 1,500 persons Friday night at a dinner meeting in connection with the 74th annual convention of the American Bar association.

He said a recent amendment gives President Truman power to strike out income tax deductions which have a basis in price or wage control violations.

Johnston declared: "This is a weapon we are prepared to use whenever we have no other choice — whenever the stabilization program is threatened by deliberate defiance."

"We may be approaching that situation right now with respect to some of the most important items in short supply — such as metals, such as beef."

Without elaborating on his references to "beef and metals," Johnston continued:

"I want to serve notice right now that we are going to give no quarter to black marketeers, and will use all of our powers against them."

Johnston did not enlarge on the tax amendment, either.

Johnston, speaking extemporaneously, digressed from his prepared text, but he authorized its use.

He claimed that the consumer price index has risen only one percent since he has been in office.

Beef Situation Bad, Probably Will Get Worse

The beef situation is tightening up. Many signs indicate it will probably get worse before it gets any better.

Even the army is having trouble buying meat. It announced that it might have to seek to buy beef overseas.

According to the army quartermaster market center at Chicago, some major packers have not been able to bid on the army's request for 13,000,000 pounds of boneless beef needed to feed troops throughout the nation.

The latest difficulties of the packers stem from sharply increased costs of beef on the hoof — increases which they say have more than offset the penny-a-pound boost the packers were allowed by the Office of Price Stabilization.

Wholesale beef prices are advancing. Supplies in the big packing houses are running low. Ranchers are holding back their cattle. More meat is reported finding its way into the black market. Office of Price Stabilization investigators were dispatched this week to Chicago, Cleveland, Philadelphia and other major packing centers.

Democratic, Republican Heads Swap Opinions Over President Truman's Chances For Re-Election Next Year

WASHINGTON — (AP) — A Democrat's assertion President Truman "can beat anybody at the polls in 1952" brought Republican retorts that the GOP presidential nominee will win if he wages a fighting campaign.

And a Republican's prediction that Gen. Dwight D. Eisenhower will be "available" for the party's nomination evoked from Senator Brewster (R-Me) the statement that Eisenhower is now more than ever the indispensable man in Europe." Brewster is plugging Senator Taft (R-Ohio) for the nomination.

Edward J. Flynn, Democratic national committeeman from New York, said after a White House call that Mr. Truman could defeat any opponent next year, including Eisenhower.

At the capitol a bit later, Harry Darby, Kansas Republican national committeeman, said of Eisenhower:

"He's always been a great soldier and we feel he will submit to the will of the people and be available for the Republican nomination."

Flynn declared the Republicans "can't beat somebody with nobody," and that they have nothing but "blatherskites and stuffed shirts."

On the Democrats' side, Senator Humphrey (D-Minn) said he agrees with Flynn that Mr. Truman can win next year. Asked whether the president could defeat Eisenhower, Humphrey replied: "I am saying only this: Mr. Truman can win in 1952. I hope he runs. I'm for him."

House, but "this time we must have someone who will take the aggressive initiative."

Brewster Echoes Raft

Told of Darby's forecast that Eisenhower will be available for the Republican nomination, Brewster declared:

"Whomever the Republicans select as their candidate will win next year. Eisenhower is doing a great job in Europe."

"But every development since my return indicates he is now more than ever the indispensable man in Europe. It seems to me increasingly doubtful that he will be able to turn to activities other than the unification of Europe."

Auto Industry Lacks Materials To Meet Goals

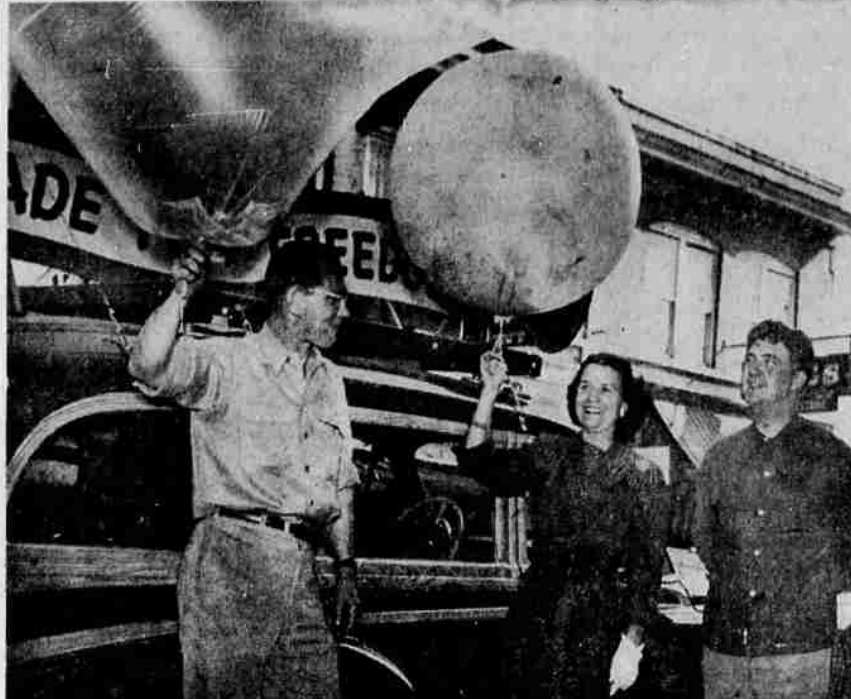

DETROIT — (AP) — Some auto industry experts are saying the car makers cannot build 1,100,000 passenger cars in this year's final quarter.

That's the maximum output total set by the National Production Authority for the October-December quarter. Rumor has it the NPA figure will be further reduced because of materials shortages.

Industry authorities say, however, that regardless of NPA action, the car companies will not be able to find enough material to build more than 800,000 passenger cars in the final three months of this year.

industry circles about production and demand. Some reports have it that new car sales are lagging in many sections. At the same time the sales chiefs say production has dropped to the point where shipments to dealers already have been sharply cut back.

Independent investigation indicates this is true so far of several makes of cars. Some dealers, of course, still have enough cars in their inventories to be able to offer immediate delivery. Yet it seems a safe prediction right now that despite the newest price hikes a new car shortage is coming.

Persons close to the auto industry say the car makers' suppliers already are running behind their schedules. There isn't much chance this condition will improve for many months.
