Picture Of Oregon Cavemen Used In Russia To Promote Anti-Religious Propaganda

GRANTS PASS — (AP) — A picture of the local Oregon Cavemen as they greeted Gov. Thomas E. Dewey of New York during the 1948 presidential campaign at Grants Pass is being used in Russia as anti-religious propaganda.

That startling revelation is contained in a letter received here from a U.S. foreign service courier, who is a former Oregon resident. His name is being withheld for obvious reason.

Visiting Leningrad's Kazar sorbor, once a beautiful cathedral, the courier was startled to see a huge replica of the Dewey-Cavemen meeting, the courier wrote.

He was even more startled at the caption, which was translated for him as follows: "In the U. S., the power of the church is synonymous with the power of Wall street. The down-trodden masses are forced to sustain the wealthy priests and hierarchy in kingly splendor while they themselves are forced to scrape the garbage pails behind the churches for something to eat. Resentment has been growing in the U.S. towards this religious feudalism. Recently a group of peasants have formed a new organization to return to the old pre-church days. They say that return to the pre-historic era is better than the present conditions, hence the attire worn by these Americans. This is a picture of this organization protesting against the cruel and vicious Wall-street backed church. Pictured with them is T. E. Dewey, a known anti-religious leader and once candidate for president

of the U.S. He was defeated by the Wall street industrialists. "This Cavemen organization is making him an honorary member of their group. Part of the initiation is performed by drinking blood and eating raw meat. While the group's anti-religious campaign is noteworthy, their appearance can only bear out the savage and barbaric character of the American as a whole."

The correspondent comments: "I'm sure that, if the Coo's Bay Pirates get wind of this, they probably will want their picture hung in the Kremlin."

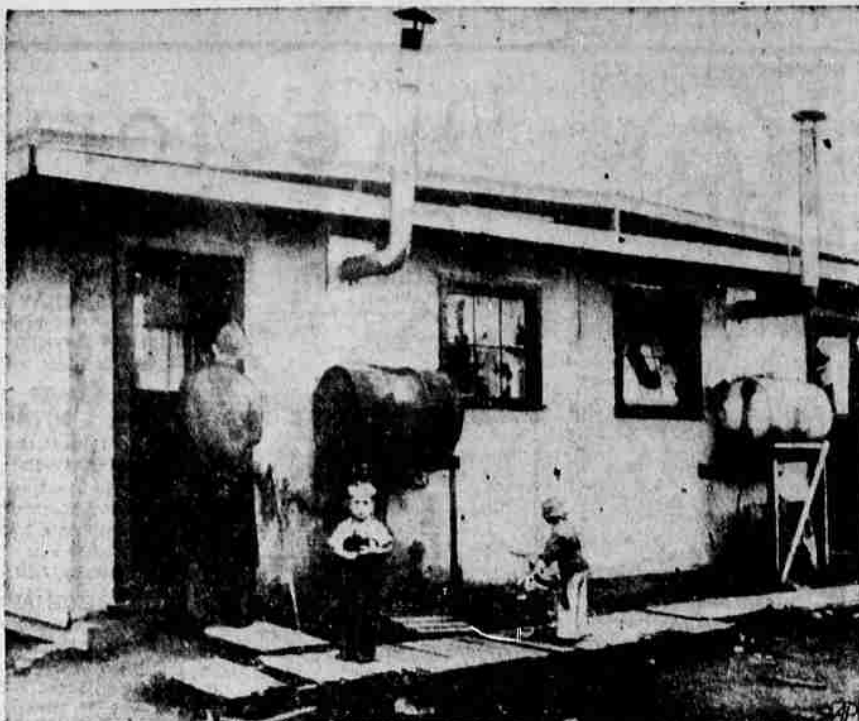
Camas Valley
