Candidate Being Sought By Republican Governors

By JACK BELL GALTINBURG, Tenn. — (AP) — Republican differences over a presidential candidate for 1952 were reflected Monday at the 43rd annual governors' conference here. An Associated Press poll among the 25 GOP governors showed nine voting for Eisenhower, four supporting Sen. Robert A. Taft of Ohio and the rest not expressing an opinion.

There was indecision among GOP governors both on whether Eisenhower would be available or would be satisfactory as a nominee. Talk among both Republicans and Democrats about the White House race next year was heard as the governors' conference was poised to tackle national defense problems.

Democrats outside the south stuck to President Truman as both parties' members talked politics at high speed while awaiting a roundtable discussion with George C. Marshall, former secretary of defense. Charles E. Wilson, the defense mobilizer, and Millard F. Caldwell, civilian defense administrator.

Sentiments Expressed The pro-Eisenhower sentiments expressed by some governors were offset somewhat by these developments: 1. Gov. Earl Warren of California indicated — if he didn't actually say so — that he will be a favorite son candidate for the GOP nomination.

The theme of four of the Republican governors who spoke out at news conferences yesterday was that Eisenhower has a better chance of winning in 1952 than Taft. They were Govs. Peterson, Edward F. Arn of Kansas, Sherman Adams of New Hampshire and Walter J. Kohler Jr. of Wisconsin.

Gov. Thomas E. Dewey of New York, the 1944 and 1948 GOP presidential nominee, said he doesn't know if Eisenhower is a Democrat or a Republican. Two Democratic governors who didn't want to be quoted by name answered poll queries by saying they would support Eisenhower as their party's nominee.

The south gave little support to Mr. Truman, with only Govs. Sid McMath of Arkansas, Kerr Scott of North Carolina and a third southerner who didn't want to be named publicly, casting their lot with the President.

Federal Investigation Of Cicero Riot Ordered

WASHINGTON — (AP) — Attorney General McGrath said he is ordering a federal grand jury investigation of the July race disorders in Cicero, Ill., which developed when a Negro family tried to move into a white neighborhood.

Rioting involving an estimated 3,000 persons broke out and was brought under control only after the national guard was called out. The riots wrecked the apartment building involved so badly it is still unoccupied, McGrath was told.

The Cook county grand jury indicted the chief of police for not controlling the mob, and the owner of the apartment house, the attorney who represented the Negro tenant, and others on charges of conspiracy to cause a riot.

The FBI also investigated, and McGrath told a delegation that on the basis of its findings, he will bring the case before a federal grand jury in Chicago.

First Christian Western Premiered By Graham

HOLLYWOOD — (AP) — Revivalist Billy Graham premiered "the world's first Christian western" motion picture here before the largest crowd of the season at Hollywood bowl.

A turnaway throng jammed the aisles and overflowed onto the hillside back of the 20,000-seat bowl, which temporarily suspended its "Symphonies Under the Stars" this year for lack of attendance.

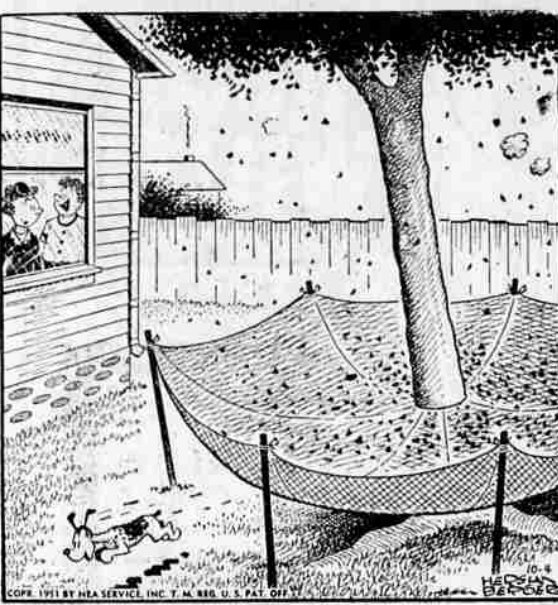
