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YMCA Benefits Summarized In Chest Appeal

One of the five organizations included in the \$29,000 Community Chest budget this year is the Roseburg Young Men's Christian association.

The "Y" has issued a budget totaling \$7,595.84. The majority of this money is earmarked for athletic and recreational activities promotion on a year-round basis for people in every age group.

The Roseburg "Y" program is expressed readily in its service to age groups "from small fry to sage" but since the organization was founded as a young man's idea, it is only fitting that primary emphasis is placed on the "small fry." A compilation, recently made by Ormond J. Feldkamp, reveals that 1,421 boys and girls under the age of 18 took part in the city's "Y" program in the last six months. This includes participation in Hi-Y and Tri Hi-Y activities, sports of all kinds, swim campaigns, "singspirations" and area competitions and conferences.

Since the "Y" idea has come to meet a universal need, it has extended into older groups, however. It has taken the form of exercise hours, athletic contests and many other forms of recreation and fellowship for both men and women. Feldkamp's report shows a total participating attendance for these activities of 8,191 persons during the first half of this year.

The budget states that only \$216.00 goes for area and national support for which the local "Y" receives supervision, leadership and training materials. For comparison's sake, the 1951 budget was \$7,026.

Tax Increase Measure Defeated In House

were inequitable and poorly balanced.

Thus any new tax conference would face a difficult problem in resolving such conflicting interests. Rep. Mills (D-Ark), one of the house conferees, remarked: "It would be difficult to write a bill that would satisfy a man who didn't want to vote for a tax bill."

Tuesday's action by the House did not kill the bill. It did set things back exactly to the stage reached weeks ago when the Senate returned the original \$7,200,000,000 house increase. It revised that bill down to \$5,400,000,000. Conference committee action upped this to \$5,732,000,000, the figure voted on Tuesday.

A letter from the CIO to all house members urging rejection of the compromise bill was said by some committee members to have had considerable influence in swinging doubtful votes. The CIO said the measure put entirely too heavy a burden on low income groups and let the wealthy off too lightly. The labor group recommended a full \$10,000,000,000 increase, as asked by President Truman, with higher corporation taxes.

Unless a conference can get together with unprecedented speed on a bill acceptable to both houses, there is no chance that proposed increases in the individual income tax and excise (sales) taxes can be put into effect Nov. 1 as planned.

the mountain, and thence to Myrtle Creek, cutting off four miles. From Myrtle Creek to Canyonville the route has been studied only by reconnaissance, which would follow to the west of Myrtle Creek through the Missouri bottoms, then crossing the river again north of Canyonville.

The highway would be two lanes, except from Garden Valley Junction to the fairgrounds, where four lanes would be built. But the right of way would be purchased and all grading completed so that an additional two lanes could be constructed when needed, or money was available, Edwards said.

Landscaping is being worked out and coordinated with construction plans, he said.

Waincott will combine information on the medical aspects of civil defense with the more immediate material on the necessity of blood donations for the wounded in Korea.

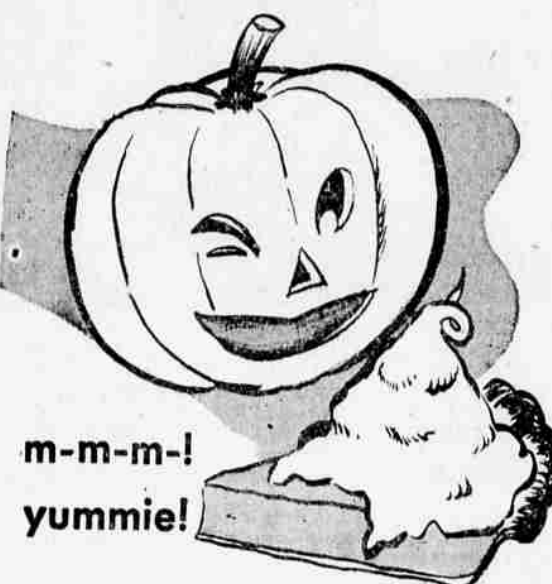
The broadcast is slated for 7:45 p.m., directly after a speech by General Douglas McArthur at the American Legion Convention in Miami, Fla.

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
