

Rotarians Shown Marine Retreat

In the dead of a bitter Korean winter the marines were surrounded near the Chosin reservoir and had to retreat to Hungnam. Their retreat, and the obstacles they encountered, were shown Rotarians at a noon luncheon in the Civic room of the Hotel Umpqua Thursday noon. Radarmen 1-c Walter Kaurlich, head of the naval organized electronics company in Roseburg, presented the film.

Before the picture was shown, Lt. Commander George Ennis, naval instructor for this area, explained the recent changes in the selective service law.

He said that it was no longer possible to avoid the draft by joining the reserves, but it could possibly shorten the time served. Since July 1, all men 19 years of age have been eligible for the draft, and membership in a reserve unit does not constitute a deferment. However, if they vol-

unteer for active duty from the reserve, they will only be required to serve two years. Ennis pointed out that if a man enlists in any of the services today, without having belonged to a branch of the reserve, he must serve at least four years on active duty.

In Tokyo, Far East naval headquarters announced two American warships suffered battle damage from Red shore batteries but both remained at their stations.

The destroyer escort Ulvert M. Moore was hit by one shell Oct. 17 off Hungnam on the Korean east coast. One man was killed and two injured. The heavy cruiser Helena's superstructure was hit Oct. 22 and the four crew members were wounded superficially.

Truce talks bogged down at Kaesong when the Reds insisted on a demarcation line straddling the old political boundary between North and South Korea.

The Communist proposal would place the cease-fire zone in the area where the battle line was before the Allies launched their attack. But nevertheless it represented a retreat from the earlier Communist insistence that the buffer line should run along parallel 38, the old dividing line between North and South Korea.

Ike's Backers Plan Aggressive Drive

NEW YORK — (AP) — The New York Times reported today that an open drive will be started within two weeks to get the Republican presidential nomination for Gen. Dwight D. Eisenhower.

In a dispatch to the Times from Washington, Anthony Leviero said that leaders of an Eisenhower-for-president movement will hold a caucus and announce a national campaign committee.

Liviero quoted the general's "chief proponents, who have been working intensively behind the scenes to develop a mood and a movement of such broad proportions that the supreme commander of the Allied powers in Europe will not ignore it."

The Times' dispatch added: "Disclosure of the imminent plan to announce the committee was made by one of the general's principal advocates on condition that his name be withheld for the time being."

"Fund-raising for the campaign and organization of Eisenhower political clubs will begin in all parts of the country immediately after the announcement."

"The general's leading backers, who have decided the time has come really to wade into the nomination under the 'proper circumstances,'"

Goodwill Air Flight From Roseburg Slated

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Hunt reminded that entrance to the airlines terminal is by way of Garden valley road and north on Mulholland drive. Churchill Swept Back Into Premiership

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night. The custom is for an outgoing prime minister to call on the king and resign on behalf of his government as soon as possible after it is certain he has been defeated.

Churchill, as leader of the winning political party, will be summoned to the palace and told to form a new government.

All Top Laborites Win

All principal Labor leaders were re-elected, even though the party as a whole was defeated.

Attlee, Herbert Morrison, Aneurin Bevan, and a large group of erstwhile cabinet ministers and officers in the Labor government have been returned to the house. Depending on the size of the final Tory majority, the Laborites may find themselves in approximately the same position as their opponents were until parliament was dissolved.

That is, the "working majority," so vital to a government, will be as difficult for the Tories to maintain as it was for Labor.

The popular vote gave an accurate reflection of the sharp cleavage of British public opinion over the success or failure of the great experiment in socialism.

Liberals Factor In Victory

With virtually all the ballots counted, the Conservatives were running behind Labor by nearly 200,000 votes. Late totals showed: Labor — 13,561,814; Conservative — 13,366,994; Liberals — 664,323.

Most probably, the deciding factor that threw this election to the Conservatives was the absence of Liberal party candidates in more than 500 of the nation's total 625 districts. The Liberals put only 109 candidates in the field.

In those areas where a straight Tory-Labor fight developed, it appeared that most of the Liberal votes went to the Tories. An analysis of the figures indicated about two out of every three Liberals voted for Churchill's party.

Even so, it was a neck-and-neck race right down to the wire.

As for the Communists, they got the thrashing of their political careers. Only 10 Reds stood for parliament. None came within miles of winning and all forfeited the 150 pound (\$420) deposit all candidates must post before the election as evidence of good faith. A candidate loses this if he fails to get an eighth of the popular vote in his constituency.
