Pope Pius Speaks On Birth Control

VATICAN CITY — (AP) — Pope Pius XII spoke out at length today on the subject of birth control, extending his remarks to warn Catholics against possible misuse of so-called "rhythm theory" of marital relations.

The pontiff's address was made to a special audience for delegates to the National Congress of Italian obstetricians, but his words obviously were directed to Catholics throughout the world. Defining the primary objective of marriage as "procreation of new life and its education," the pope not only spoke out against birth control, but warned against "blind slavery" to nature's impulses.

The pontiff spoke of the "constantly more diffused recourse (in the sexual act) to ties of natural sterility — so-called periods of non-fertility in the woman."

"This has in the past frequently been referred to as the rhythm theory of fertility and non-fertility in women." (The theory is that conception is possible only during certain periods of each month in a woman's life.)

The pope urged his listeners to base their instructions concerning this theory upon authoritative judgment and publications, and not upon "simple popular publications."

Chinese Reds Arrested Nun On Cruelty Charge

HONG KONG — (AP) — Catholic sources said Chinese Reds have arrested a Canadian nun, Sister Raymond Marie (Rose Alma LaRose), on charges of cruelty to orphans.

The 46-year old nun is sister superior of the Kweiyang orphanage in Kweichow province. She came to China 15 years ago.

The sources here said she was arrested Sept. 12. They said nothing had been heard of her since about three days after her arrest, when Red authorities ordered the two remaining mission nuns to stop bringing her food.

Filipino Troops Erase Huk Chief, 21 Followers

MANILA — (AP) — The Philippine News service today said an army task force surprised and killed a Communist Huk leader and 21 of his men Sunday on Panay island. Outgoing U. S. Ambassador Myron M. Cowen told a free elections group Sunday that "the tide of battle has turned" against the Huk in their efforts to disrupt the Nov. 13 elections.

Citizens in six provinces have asked for armed protection during the elections for nine senators, all provincial governors and mayors.

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Youth Fatally Injured When Car Hits Ditch

NEWPORT — (AP) — An automobile collided with a gravel truck, then crashed into a ditch, killing one person and critically injuring another at Neosho early today.

Sgt. Dubs Mulkey of the state police said the car occupant killed was tentatively identified as Hollie Hodge Mulkey said the car was registered to Hodge's father, Steve Hodge, Sweet Home. The youth carried a fishing license giving his age as 16 and his residence as Sweet Home.

Critically injured in the car was a companion identified as Raymond Cross Jr., 17, Sweet Home. He was hospitalized at McMinnville.

Mulkey said the car, headed south, collided with the truck on a curve about 4:30 a.m. The truck driver, Glen Zimmerman, was not hurt.

Dieting Prevents Death From Land Mine Curio

HOLLYWOOD — (AP) — LeRoy Prinz, a movie director who collects firearms as a hobby, is glad he watched his diet.

Prinz carried a land mine—a Korean war souvenir—into the police station Saturday for a check-up. He was afraid it was still alive. Before he became suspicious of the land mine, however, Prinz used it for various purposes around the house. For a time, it was a step stool.

Police told Prinz he didn't know how lucky he was. The land mine was designed to explode under 200 pounds of pressure. Prinz weighs 173.

Westfir Youth Found Dying On Highway 58

EUGENE — (AP) — A 19-year-old youth, found dying on a highway early Saturday, was identified as Francis Gutchow, Portland.

He was employed by the Hines Lumber Co. of Westfir, coroner Fred Buell said.

Gutchow died two hours after he was discovered on highway 58 five miles west of Oakridge.

Buell said death was the result of a brain injury. Police were investigating to determine whether Gutchow was the victim of a hit-run driver or had been beaten and then dumped out of a car.

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Seven Die, 22 Injured In Bus Crash At S.F.

Eishire apparently tried to straddle the concrete block, but it was too high. The left front tire blew out as the massive bus careened, it tore out 40 feet of heavy iron pipe railing before going off the ramp completely.

It struck heavily in the key system rail yards 40 feet below, pancaking the bus top and pinning all of the passengers in the battered wreckage.

The engine continued to run as the bus lay on its broken top.

Charles B. Taylor, one of the first to rush to the scene, crawled in and switched off the motor, reducing the danger that it would ignite the vehicle's fuel.

Some of the injured — once they gathered their consciousness — were able to climb out afterward through windows, but it was necessary to use hacksaws, crowbars and other rescue equipment to get the others out.

Father Slays His Two Little Sons And Himself

GADSDEN, Ala. — (AP) — Two little boys and the father who killed them and himself were buried together in a rural cemetery today.

Frank P. Morris Jr., 24, shot his sons, Jerry, 6, and Donald, 2, through the heart, drove with their bodies to the home of his estranged wife and then killed himself Saturday.

Acting Etowah county coroner P. W. Wise returned a verdict of double murder and suicide.

LUMBERMAN DIES

PORTLAND — (AP) — Paul Courtland King, Inman Poulson Lumber company vice-president, died at his home here Sunday.

Born in 1875 in North Adams, Mass., King came to Oregon in 1918 and began law practice at Bend. In 1925 he moved to Portland and joined Inman Poulson. His widow survives.

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
