Russia Faces Fateful Decision, U. S. Mobilizer Says

QUEBEC — (AP) — U. S. Defense Mobilizer Charles E. Wilson said here Russia soon must decide whether to live in peace with the free world or live in isolation under threat of eventual revolt by her satellites.

Wilson, in a speech to the Canadian chamber of commerce, said the United States will reach peak strength in its three-year, \$150,000,000 defense program in 1953. He added that if necessary, the nation can hold the pace indefinitely, taking "the strain of it in our stride."

He said he doubts if Russia can do the same, and therefore the Soviets must soon make their choice.

"You are about to see production really pouring out," Wilson asserted. The United States, he said, said, now is ready to mass produce weapons calculated to

"We have already reached the point where the strength we have acquired should cause the men in the Kremlin to pause long and to think hard before they attack us or our partners in the free world," he said.

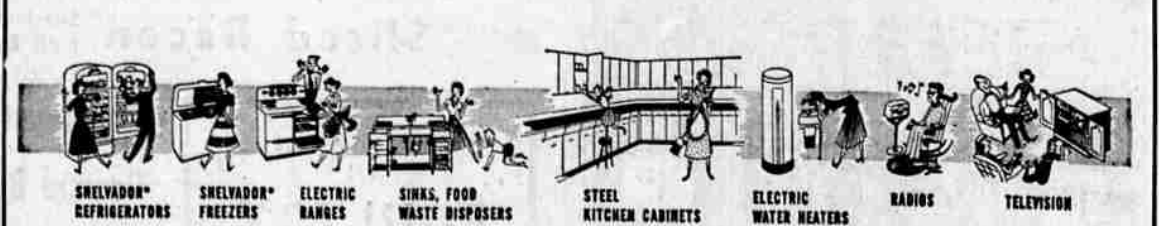
