### Roseburg Grocer Will Attend Meeting Of Assn.



Lester J. Nielsen, Roseburg, a director for the Oregon Independent Retail Grocers association, will attend the 1951 annual convention of the association, in Portland Sunday and Monday, Claude Hall, Waldport, is president.

A forum of nationally-known leaders in the food industry will be featured on the program, including J. Frank Grimes, Chicago, president of the Independent Grocers Alliance of America, said Nielsen. Grimes, pictured above, will speak on "Will Independents Fight?"

Frank Hemingway, Pacific coast newscaster over Mutual Broadcasting stations, including KRNR, will also address the trade group and conduct his Monday afternoon broadcast direct from the convention headquarters at the Hotel Multnomah.

### Patrolman Ditches His Car To Avoid School Bus

MALIBU, Calif. — (AP) — Highway patrolman Elmer Hoskins, 39, drove his patrol car off the road at 95 miles an hour to avoid hitting a school bus.

He was chasing two cars racing along U. S. highway 101. As he approached an intersection, with his siren wide open, a school bus pulled out in front of him.

"I remember seeing those little faces and big eyes looking out the window at me," said Hoskins. "I couldn't do anything else, so I dived."

The patrol car hit a ditch, bounced and rolled. Hoskins climbed out, bruised, and cited the bus driver for failure to yield the right of way to an emergency vehicle.

### Ruling Hits One-Man, Bennett Recall Move

PORTLAND — (AP) — The proposed recall attempt against City Commissioner J. E. (Jake) Bennett is out of order, City Attorney Alexander Brown ruled.

Brown said a recall could be attempted only by an organized group.

The preliminary petition filed against Bennett was from an individual, George Barnard, who accused Bennett of unbecoming conduct and prejudice against liquor and legalized gambling.

Brown's ruling stops that recall proposal. Barnard indicated, however, that he would organize a group to renew the attempt.
