Dept. Takes Steps To Remove Weed

WASHINGTON — (AP) The Interior department has declared war on the deadly western weed halogeton.

Secretary of the Interior Chapman said the bureau of land management will conduct the initial campaigns with \$2,000,000 made available by Congress to carry the work through June 30, 1952.

He said the money will be used largely for the planting of crested wheat grass, which is a sturdier plant than halogeton and has demonstrated an ability to crowd the weed off the range.

Halogeton, a poisonous cousin of the Russian thistle, first was discovered in this country in Nevada in 1935.

Stockmen began to notice increasing numbers of mysterious deaths among their cattle and sheep, but it was not until 1,300 ewes died near Malta, Idaho, in 1945, that the dangerous nature of the weed became known. By that

time halogeton had established itself widely through the west. Marion Classon, director of the Land Management bureau, said the weed grows only in arid waste lands, and moves out as soon as the land is rehabilitated.

He said the bureau has invited bids for the reseeding with crested wheat grass of about 125,000 acres, with 30,000 additional acres to be seeded later.

Missing British Savant Believed in Soviet Jail

ROME — (AP) — Two Rome newspapers have come up with a surprise angle to the mystery of Bruno Pontecorvo. They claim the Russians have jailed the missing British atom scientist in the belief he may have been spiriting Soviet atomic secrets to President Truman.

The papers, Il Tempo and Momento Sera, quoted unidentified Russian sources in Stockholm. The Italian-born Pontecorvo disappeared — presumably behind the Iron Curtain — in October, 1950, while vacationing in Europe with his family.

The paper said the Russians, fearing the United States had a spy among their top atom scientists, had nabbed Pontecorvo in the belief he may have been the source of information on which President Truman based his announcement of atomic explosions in the Soviet Union.
