### Churches Use Modern Publicity Media In Vigorous Promotion Of Their Faith

NEW YORK — (AP) — They had a good story to tell, but didn't know how to tell it. That, until recent times, is what radio experts have thought about broadcasting efforts by the churches. Their use of other mass outlets has been similarly sporadic.

This has changed.

The churches have put trained craftsmen to work producing radio and television shows. Many have set up skilled public relations departments and expanded their newspaper advertising.

Instead of having to beg stations for time on a purely "public interest" basis, leading religious bodies today are turning out shows the broadcasters are glad to get.

Says Dr. Romold Bridges, head of the broadcasting and film division of the National Council of Churches of Christ in the U.S.A.: "We are raising the standards of religious performances to a professional level so stations are not penalized with slovenly, ignorant, amateurish programs claiming time. We are elevating religious shows to a point where they are wanted."

That this process is taking place was echoed by Dr. George Crothers, religious broadcasting director of the Columbia Broadcasting system.

Like his colleagues in the radio business, Crothers feels that churches have "lagged about 30 years behind the times" in the radio field.

"Up until now," he said, "they've let opportunity pass them by. But now, the churches apparently have awakened to the possibilities of radio and TV and are doing a much better job."

**Use Of TV Welcomed**

The impetus has come from Protestant, Catholic and Jewish bodies alike.

Dr. Clayton T. Griswold, head of the radio-television department of the Presbyterian church of the U.S.A., also cited rejuvenated church broadcasting activity, and said:

"For the church of the twentieth century not to make extensive use of television and radio would be as unthinkable as if St. Paul had refused to travel in ships or Luther and Calvin had regarded the printing press as unworthy of use."

In the public relations line, many churches — which once shied away from anything resembling press agency — have decided that their message deserves expert, dignified publicizing in this age of mass communications.

Nearly all large bodies now have experienced public relations staffs. Many are expanding. For example, the Methodist church last year tripled its public relations budget and opened full-time offices in Dallas, Indianapolis, Los Angeles, Louisville, Atlanta and Columbus, Ohio.
