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Solon Skeptical Of Cease-Fire Huddle Benefit

EUREKA, Calif. — (AP) — Senator William F. Knowland (R-Calif.) says he is skeptical of the effectiveness of any agreement that may come out of the current cease-fire negotiations in Korea.

Speaking to the Republican state central committee, Knowland said, "The Communists are going to use the time to build up air bases north of the 38th parallel and move up armed forces. Then in time of their own selection will strike there or elsewhere."

He asked, "Will any settlement of the Korean war require guarantees from the Chinese Communists and their Soviet overlords that they will not use the troops freed in Korea against Formosa or southeast Asia?"

"It is clear to any competent military man that we are better able to win a victory in the narrow peninsula of Korea, where our fleet can operate on both the east and west flanks, and we are closer to our bases in Japan and Okinawa," Knowland said. He pointed out that in the vast expanses of southeast Asia "the hordes of Chinese Communists could have room for maneuvers which they lack in Korea."

The senator also called upon Congress to repudiate the Yalta agreement and state that U. S. policy is not to enter into secret agreements.

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
