17 Children Attend Operation On Father

CHAMBERSBURG, Pa. — (AP) — For the first time in 15 years, the big family of 68-year-old Howard Kerlin had a reunion — at his bedside in a hospital room here.

Kerlin, a retired farmer, was told he should undergo surgery for an ailment the nature of which was not disclosed. But he refused to consent until he saw his nine sons and eight daughters, ranging in age from 17 to 41. Deeply touched by their coming, his mind at peace, Kerlin gave way and was operated on.

Five daughters came from Long Beach, Calif., the others of the 17 from western Pennsylvania and one from Maryland. Their mother agreed with them that "the get-together boosted our morale as much as it did Dad's."

Chemicals In Water Aid Teeth, Research Finding

WASHINGTON — (AP) — After a study of the pros and cons, a special committee of the national research council has concluded that the addition of certain chemicals to drinking water can help reduce tooth decay.

In endorsing the fluoridation of public water supplies, however, the committee said it should be done only under expert dental and engineering supervision by state boards of health.

A report made by the group on Wednesday said the safety of fluoridation depends on proper controls. It also said that its effectiveness depends on proper selection of water supplies to be treated.

Because of the controversy over the matter, the committee was appointed last spring to make the study. Its parent body, the national research council, is a federation of scientific societies chartered by Congress.

Building Expansion Program Issue In Consolidation Vote Scheduled For December 14

Residents of Roseburg school district 4 and of 11 neighboring districts will vote Dec. 14 upon a proposed consolidation. Voting will take place in the schools of the respective districts, except in Roseburg, where three polling places have been provided — Senior high, Junior high and Riverside schools.

For a number of years elementary school districts adjacent to Roseburg have been sending their high school pupils to Roseburg's Senior high school, with the cost paid by the county non-high school district board.

The present enrollment of tuition pupils is 435, more than one-third of the high school student body. Because more building must be done to accommodate high school population next year, an election has been called to determine whether the whole area shall vote to bond for the needed building, or whether Roseburg district 4 shall bond itself for these buildings and continue to take tuition pupils.

This is the first of a series of articles prepared for the News-Review by Supt. Elliott to enlighten the public on the proposed consolidation of neighboring districts with Roseburg.

The area extends from Umpqua on the north to Tenmile on the south, with a total census of 6741. The enrollment includes 3669 elementary and 1159 high school pupils, making a total of 4828. The staff includes 209 members, teaching in 195 rooms, in 35 buildings. There is a need for 20 additional rooms for next fall, with only four available rooms to fill that need.

The proposed district would be exceeded in size only by Portland, Salem, Eugene, Springfield and by the county school districts of Klamath Falls.

Several large districts during the last year have met their growth needs by consolidation, but have not reported their census or enrollment.

Religion Is A Necessity, Bishop Tells Protestants

ATLANTA — (AP) — "Religion is not a luxury we can forego — it is the most desperate necessity of our lives."

Bishop Arthur J. Moore, president of the Methodist council of bishops, made that statement last night at the opening session of a convocation of 15 protestant denominations.

"The most fruitful periods of our nation's history have been those when people honored God and sought to live a righteous and sober life," declared Bishop Moore. A decline in religious conviction is usually followed by a decline in morality.

He addressed about 1,000 representatives from 10 southern states attending a convocation of the National Council of the Churches of Christ in the U.S.A. The council is a movement to achieve church co-operation on common problems. It does not concern itself with doctrine.

"Our world has been invaded by secularism and our souls by half faith," the bishop continued. "Unless we can have revival of spiritual religion, our boasted civilization, despite all its material excellencies, will slide into an abyss. We must find God's plan for our world or face the continued decline of human hope and civilization."

Communism Condemned
The Rt. Rev. Henry Knox Sherrill, presiding bishop of the Protestant Episcopal Church and president of the council, labeled Communism a doctrine whose "purpose is to destroy the Christian church through tomorrow."

Earlier, Dr. Roswell P. Barnes of New York, said in an interview: "I believe that probably the revelation of civic corruption and the penetration of community life, notably government, by organized gambling and vice has led a lot of people to believe that something dangerous has happened to moral standards."
