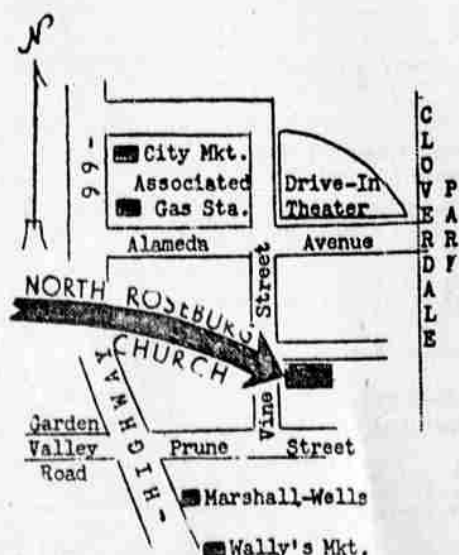

Turkeys Killed At Trucks Collide

Three turkeys perished and others were scattered all over the highway, when two trucks collided on highway 99 in the Pass creek area, near Drain, Thursday night.

State police report that the brakes locked on the trailer of a truck operated by Roland Samuel Christie, Grants Pass, driving for Rogue Farm, Inc., headed south. Christie's trailer slid into the truck, loaded with turkeys, operated by Leonard Harold Shafer, Eugene. Shafer, accompanied by Edward R. Wright, Eugene, was driving for Oregon Turkey Growers.

There was minor damage to the trucks, but turkeys were scattered over the highway and considerable time was required in getting them loaded back on the truck.

East Germany Imprisons 50,000 Anti-Communists

BERLIN — (AP) — An anti-Soviet underground movement reported today East Germany has imprisoned "at least" 3,000 men and women as "dangerous" to the Communist regime.

None of these 50,000, the report said, have been included in the amnesty of 20,000 prisoners promised by the East German regime as part of its campaign for all-German elections.

Man's Survival Possible In Event Of Atomic Attack

Could you survive an atomic attack?

Your chances are good if you follow a prescribed method of defense and act quickly.

That was the advice contained in a film — "Pattern for Survival" — shown Roseburg Rotarians at a noon luncheon in the Umpqua hotel Thursday. The picture was presented by the Umpqua Dairy Products Co.

Man is not a helpless agent in the face of an attack, but survival depends upon a carefully planned method of protection was the warning contained in the picture.

A person within danger area of an explosion is subject to injury from three atomic phenomenon:

1. A shock wave that immediately follows the initial blast.
2. A heat flash which produces extremely high temperatures, and
3. Gamma rays — injurious radio active rays.

But escaping the original explosion does not mean that a person is immune from further damage. After the bomb has exploded radio active rays are dissipated within a mile radius, and they remain potentially dangerous for an extended period of time.

Destruction of "ground zero" — the point directly below the exploding bomb — is virtually complete. However, survival is possible if underground shelters with cement walls four feet thick are provided.

Persons living within three miles of an industrial center were advised to construct a bomb shelter. For the fullest protection an outdoor concrete shelter was recommended, but a cellar, with an outside entrance, will also serve.

If neither are available, an ordinary room with the least number of windows can be converted into an adequate shelter if the ceiling is re-enforced with heavy timbers.

In event of a surprise attack, those in the immediate danger area should take refuge under

heavy furniture or crouch next to a building.

The eyes should be shielded from the brilliant flash.

An emergency kit containing water, food and medical supplies should be prepared and kept available at all times.

Persons living near a waterfront were warned that water dispersed by an atomic bomb carries a high content of radio active rays that can cause death.

Circuit Court Juries Decide Three Cases

Three circuit court trials were decided Wednesday and Thursday by juries.

Damages of \$5,975 were awarded Donald W. Green in a suit against Marion Lyle Shafer. Green said he received permanent knee injury in a highway accident Apr. 14, 1951.

A jury determined Glen Forbes was working for the Gledale Lumber company at the time of an accident for which he's asking compensation from the State Industrial Accident commission. Compensation payments for a leg amputation are to be determined by the commission. Whether he was working at the time of the accident was the sole issue in the trial.

M. Crawford Jr. was awarded \$1,500 of the \$2,178.31 he claimed was due in a suit against H. R. Ketell as commission for sale and rental of dwellings in Cloverdale park.
