

Huge Grizzly Bear Slain in British Columbia

VICTORIA, B. C. — (CP) — Somewhere in the Burns lake area of British Columbia two guides are heading toward civilization with what they hope is a record silvertip grizzly skull.

It was shot by Lloyd Walker, co-owner of Seattle's Moore hotel, on a hunting trip with Dr. Darrell G. Leavitt, also of Seattle. In Victoria for a lecture and film showing, Mr. Walker described his record trophy.

He said after he shot the huge animal he brought out his hide, and a twig cut to equal width of the bear's massive skull. It measured 17 inches.

When they learned that the record grizzly of the Davy Crockett league was 18 1/4 inches, they telephoned their B. C. guides to find the skull since it might be a record.

Estimated weight of the bear was 1,100 pounds. The hide measured 11 by 10 feet, and the big silvertip's claws were 4 inches in length.

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Elks Lodge Launches Drive To Raise Huge Blood Quota

Elks' goal is one third of the three-million pint total needed by July 1.

The Roseburg Elks lodge will contribute 1,300 pints of blood to its quota in the Elks armed forces blood campaign to raise one million pints of blood for the nation's fighting men by July 1, 1952, Ed Nolte, exalted ruler, announces.

The pledge of one million pints of blood, made to Secretary of Defense Robert A. Lovett by Howard R. Davis, national grand exalted ruler of the Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks, on Oct. 26 is one-third of the three million

pints which must be obtained by July 1, to provide blood and blood plasma for wounded service men in Korea, and to rebuild exhausted reserves.

The campaign quota for the Elks in Oregon is 33,100 pints. Quotas are based on Elks membership and are equivalent roughly to one pint per member. Heading up the Elks drive in Roseburg is Sherman Morris and Zeke Walton.

Any person in good health, between the ages of 21 and 59 years of age, may donate blood once every two months, not to exceed five times a year. Those between 18 and 21 years of age, except those who are married between that age or in the military service, are required to have parents or guardians consent.

All Elks and those donating blood in their behalf should state that they are donating blood for the exclusive use of the armed forces, said Morris. Otherwise, it may be diverted to civilian use as the Red Cross collects blood for both purposes. To meet the pledge made by the grand exalted ruler, the Roseburg lodge should supply approximately 300 pints each month, until next July 1.

The bloodmobile will be at the Roseburg lodge of Elks Friday, Dec. 14, between the hours of 2 and 7 p.m., and every Elk who can be available is urged to be there, Morris said.
