

## **Recall Of Gen. MacArthur Justified By Senate Probe Findings, Morse Declares**

PORTLAND-(AP)-Senator Wayne Morse said here a restudy of the MacArthur controversy of last spring leads to but one conclusion:

"It is the duty of the President to recall General Mac-Arthur."

The senator told the City club that he had restudied the issue because he found it still alive in Oregon. It has prompted more questions, he said, than any other issue since he has returned home from Washington.
