U. Of O. Student On List Of Oxford Scholarships

PRINCETON, N. J. — Three Pacific Northwestern students were among 32 persons awarded scholarships to Oxford university in England in this year's Rhodes competition.

The winners were announced by Dr. Frank Aydelotte of the institute for advanced study.

The successful candidates from district 8 (northwestern) are Alexander Rinsanovsky, Eugene, Ore., university of Oregon; Alan C. Enthoven, Seattle, Stanford university, and John R. Hughes, Twin Falls, Idaho, University of Washington.

Enthoven and Hughes said they plan to use their scholarships, which entitle them to a minimum of two years at Oxford, to continue their studies in economics. Rinsanovsky, who has received a bachelor's degree of philosophy at the University of Oregon and is now doing graduate work in languages, said he plans to study philosophy under the scholarship.

The students were chosen by a district committee which met at Spokane.

Cranberry Parfait
Tasty New Idea

For your Christmas entertaining, here are two delightful recipes. The stuffed mushrooms can be served as hot canapés before dinner and the parfait is light and delicate and as red as holly.

Stuffed Broiled Mushrooms
(Makes 4 servings)

Six-ounce can broiled mushroom crowns, 3-ounce can deviled ham, 1/2 teaspoon mustard, 1/2 teaspoon grated onion, 1/2 teaspoon minced parsley.

Drain mushrooms, reserving broth for other use. Scoop out stem ends of mushroom crowns with sharp knife of melon baller. Finely chop stem ends. Combine deviled ham, chopped mushroom stems, mustard, onion and parsley. Stuff mixture back into mushroom crowns.

Arrange in shallow pan to go under broiler. Broil 4 inches from moderate heat in preheated broiling compartment until thoroughly hot, about 5 minutes. Serve as hot canapés, or to top scrambled eggs on toast.

Cranberry Parfait
(Makes 8 servings)

One egg white, 2 tablespoons sugar, 1 egg yolk, 2 cups milk, 2 or 3 tablespoons sugar, 1-8 teaspoon salt, 3 tablespoons quick-cooking tapioca, 1 teaspoon vanilla, to

1 1/2 cups cranberry sauce or cranberry jelly, 1/2 cup cream, whipped

Beat egg white until foamy throughout; add 2 tablespoons sugar, 1 tablespoon at a time, and continue beating with rotary egg beater until mixture will stand in soft peaks. Set aside. Mix egg yolk with about 1/4 cup of the milk in saucepan. Add 2 or 3 tablespoons sugar, salt, tapioca and remaining milk. Place over medium heat.

Cook until mixture comes to a boil, stirring constantly—this takes 5 to 8 minutes. Pour small amount of hot tapioca mixture gradually on beaten egg white, blending well. Then quickly add the remaining mixture, stirring constantly. (The hotter the tapioca and the faster it is blended in, the thicker and fluffier the pudding will be.) Add vanilla.

Cool, stirring once after 15 or 20 minutes. Chill. Serve the tapioca cream and cranberry sauce layered in parfait glasses. (Make 5 layers, beginning with cranberry sauce). Top with the whipped cream.
