 Mr. and Mrs. N. E. Hatfield of Roseburg went to Portland last weekend and visited Mr. Hawley in the hospital.

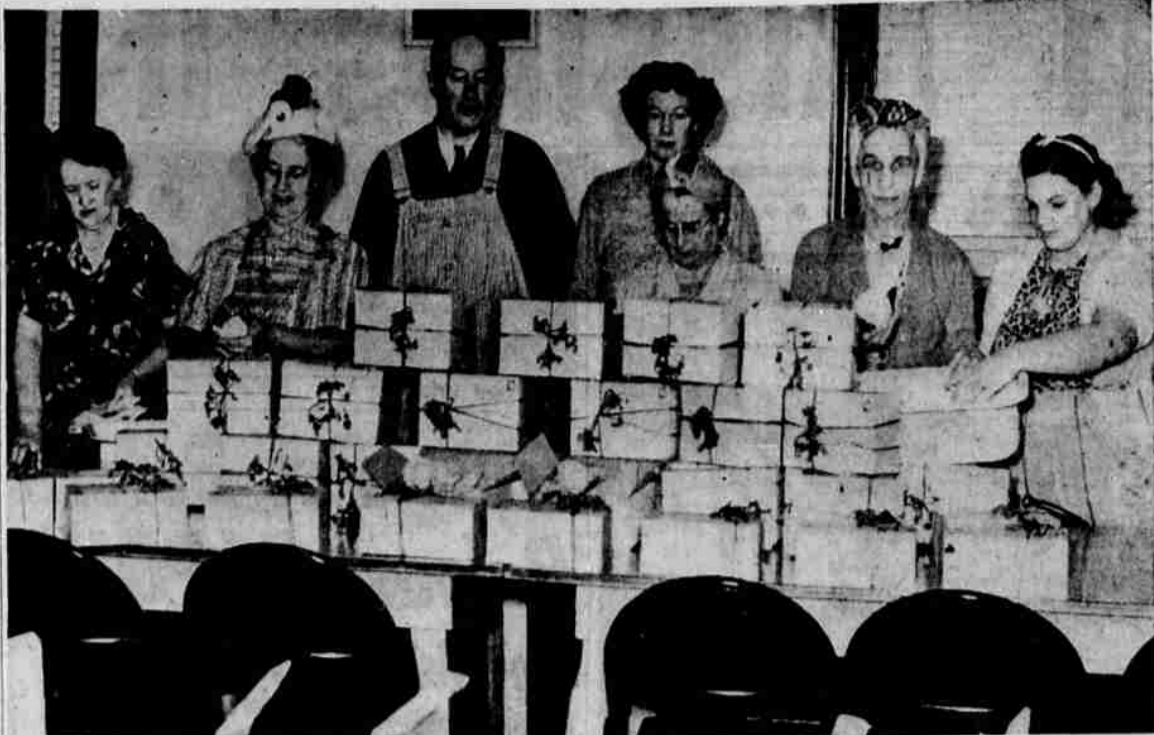
**Tau Eta Eta Sorority To Address Polio Mail**
