### March Of Dimes Fund Campaign Helped By Scouts

Around South Miami, Fla. these days it is probable that groceries are being delivered more quickly and papers distributed more efficiently than anywhere else in the country. "The Men" are already at work raising, "by the sweat of their brows," their contribution for the 1952 March of Dimes campaign.

Last year "The Men," for members of Cub Scout Pack 24, after months of hard work, quietly mailed in their contribution for \$100.54 to campaign headquarters. Pack 24 is made up of youngsters between the ages of eight and ten years — shavers too young to be Boy Scouts.

Leader of the Pack is frail, elderly A. Travers Ewell, known to its members as Mister Ewell. Mister Ewell calls his charges "The Men." All undertakings of the Pack are carried out under a solemn "Sweat-of-our-Brows" policy.

This policy — and it is a serious one — determined that "The Men" of Pack 24 should contribute to the March of Dimes. Helping polio victims was something "a man" of eight or nine could understand. Hadn't he seen fellow Cubs stricken, suddenly crippled by polio?

Naturally "Men" couldn't ask their parents for quarters or half dollars to give to the March of Dimes. The only way to aid a cause they had already decided was a good thing was to "got out and earn money by the sweat of your brows," Mister Ewell told them.

stored in a Yokohama warehouse ready to be flown to prisoners. Some of the packages contain special foods for men suffering from malnutrition. Medical kits containing all drugs which might be needed by the prisoners also are ready for distribution.

They reached formal agreement on two minor points — to halt hostilities within 24 hours after a truce is effective and to withdraw from the 2 1/2 mile buffer zone within 72 hours.

But there was no indication that agreement was near on issues which have deadlocked the negotiations for weeks:

1. Allied insistence on the right to rotate troops and replace worn equipment and supplies.
2. The U. N. demand for a ban pair.
3. Inspection behind the lines during an armistice, including aerial observation.

Although Mrs. Jensen was able to escape the burning ship, she was unable to remove any of her belongings. Persons evacuated were allowed only the "clothing they were wearing."

The ship, one of the East Asiatic lines, was bound for Copenhagen, Denmark, through the Panama Canal zone.

The survivors are to report to San Francisco where they will be issued duplicates of drivers licenses and important papers that were lost with the ship.

Mrs. Jensen's late husband was president and a part owner in the shipping line.
