**Maxim Offered Big Sum For Fight With Matthews**

BOISE — (AP) — Promoter Tex Hager says his offer still goes: He'll guarantee Light Heavy-weight Champion Joey Maxim \$60,000 if he will meet Harry Matthews in a title bout here next summer.

The International Boxing club in New York City announced yesterday that Matthews, of Seattle and Ola, Ida., has been offered a title match with Maxim Feb. 22.

Renewing his earlier bid to "top any legitimate offer," Hager said last night the outdoor fight he proposes "will draw more people" than an indoor fight in either New York City or San Francisco.

Hager estimated upwards of 15,000 people would pay to see the match here.

**Indian Five Weakened By Loss Of LeRoy Elting**

Chances for victories over Medford and Grants Pass took a jolt this week.

Coach Dick Ballantyne reports that LeRoy Elting may not play in either of the weekend games because of an injury received in the Willamette game last week. This just about wipes out the only scoring punch that could be counted on.

**PW Check Urged By Sen. Cordon**

WASHINGTON — Senator Guy Cordon, Republican, Oregon said the Communist - announced number of prisoners "appears to me to be low." He said that "we cannot take their word for it."

Cordon said the situation "absolutely requires an investigation" of the number of war prisoners by a "wholly disinterested, neutral source."

He said that any truce based on the "unsupported word of the Communists" in this connection would be "disastrous."

However, Cordon disagreed with Senator Stennis of Mississippi on the issue of possible trails of Korean war criminals. He said: "War trials come only when you have a victor and vanquished. Under a truce agreement, you just don't have war criminal trials."

**Indians' Mathias Hurt In Practice Session**

PALO ALTO, Calif. — (AP) — Stanford fullback Bob Mathias sprained his ankle in scrimmage yesterday and will be forced to go easy until after Christmas in workouts for the Jan. 1 Rose Bowl game.

But Coach Chuck Taylor said the Tulare, Calif. blaster will be running at full speed when the Indians resume practice at Arrowhead Springs Dec. 26.

Halfback Eric Southwood of Los Angeles quit the squad after deciding his injured knee could not stand the punishment of contact work. He had been missing from the lineup since early in the season.

The warming up period for the Indians is all over, Taylor said. Today a full scrimmage with varsity banging into varsity will lead off two-a-day workouts.

**Message Of Pope May Point To 21 New Cardinals**

VATICAN CITY — (AP) — The annual Christmas eve message of Pope Pius XII to the college of cardinals Monday may indicate whether a consistory will be held soon to fill the 21 vacancies in the sacred college. Vatican sources are saying one may be held in the early spring.

The pope will receive the cardinals' traditional Christmas greetings at 10:30 a.m. (4:30 a. m., EST). His reply will be broadcast to the world.

In 1945, with the college of cardinals down to 38 members, the Vatican on Dec. 23 announced the names of 32 new princes of the church to bring the membership to full strength of 70. The next day, in his Christmas message, the pontiff told the cardinals his reasons for fortifying the college. The consistory was held in February, 1946.

Today there are only 49 cardinals. Death has claimed 21. One, Josef Cardinal Mindszenty, is behind the bars of a Communist prison in Hungary. He remains the only living cardinal in the vast area dominated by the Soviet union.

**Thousands Slain By Reds**

The Roman Catholic hierarchy in Switzerland reports that more than 13,000 priests and members of Catholic religious orders have been killed, jailed or exiled in Iron Curtain countries. It said that in the Ukraine alone, 3,600 were killed. This week the Fides agency, specializing in Catholic missionary news, reported that 1,240 missionaries were expelled from Communist China. Thomas Cardinal Tien, archbishop of Peiping who was elevated at the last consistory, has been unable to return to his archdiocese and is now in the United States.

If a consistory is held, it is believed the Pope will fill all the vacancies, since many dioceses traditionally headed by a cardinal now have none. These include Boston and St. Louis in the U. S., Prague, Czechoslovakia, whose primate, archbishop Josef Beran, has been exiled by the Communists; Paris, Warsaw and others.

The new cardinals also may include the first Negro member of the college in Catholic church history. Since 1900 the number of Catholics in Africa has increased from little more than a million to 14 million.
