Registration for winter quarter at Southern Oregon college will begin Wednesday, Jan. 2, announces Mrs. Mabel W. Winston, registrar and dean of women. Classes will reconvene the following day and registration for new courses will continue through Jan. 16.

Faculty members will attend registration meetings to give counseling service to students, assuring that proper course work will be the same as that of fall term with the addition of a class to be taught by Dr. Arthur S. Taylor, professor of social science. Thirty-eight Douglas county students were enrolled in the Ashland institution during the recently completed quarter, Mrs. Winston reports. Fourteen of that number are Roseburg residents.

Extra-curricular activities will begin with a registration dance on Jan. 2 followed by a weekend basketball series with Oregon College of Education. Special events planned during the winter term include the third annual high school speech conference, a festival of arts and the annual school basketball tourney.

Physical expansion of the campus plant will continue as construction is started on an annex to the women's dormitory. A scenic mall will be landscaped in front of the new library-classroom building.

comes in a mile-long section, making it substandard for state highway purposes should extension of Highway 225 be considered, the court said.

The accepted route would follow just north of the course of the North Umpqua river.

Opens Vast Area

"This road would open up a vast recreational area along the Umpqua river. It would open up about 12 farms that have never had a road, some of these the largest ranches in Douglas county," the announcement continued.

"The road from Sutherland up Cooper creek to Lone rock, we believe, is the best route for a connecting link between Highway 225 and the North Umpqua highway," Edgar J. Murnen Sutherland, chairman of the Sutherland delegation, was out of town and not available for comment on the court's decision.

Fire Damage To Home Said Less Than Reported

Russia Speeds War Production

WASHINGTON (AP)—Stanislaw Mikolajczyk, Poland's exiled premier, says Russia is speeding war preparations in her Mid-European satellites.

He told a news conference Friday that during the past six months he learned from the Iron Curtain underground:

1. there is an unexplained food shortage in Middle Europe, whereas all these nations except Czechoslovakia normally produce food surpluses.

2. Gasoline is scarce in Romania, an oil producer.

3. Middle Europe's steel output has been increased and new foundries opened in East Germany, Poland and Hungary.

4. Soviet Deputy Premier Molotov, at a July 22 meeting with Mid-European leaders in Poland, demanded more military production.

5. "Unnecessary" people, that is, those cool to Communism, are being moved out of larger cities. Mikolajczyk said he suspects gasoline, meat and grain are being stored for use by the Red Army.

John Calvin McCulloch, 85, lifelong resident of Tenmile, died at Douglas Community hospital Thursday after a short illness.

He was born at Tenmile, Nov. 2, 1866, the son of James K. and Ruth Freeman McCulloch, pioneer settlers of Tenmile. He was married to Nannie Ollivant, who preceded him in death several years ago. Except for about six years in California, he spent all his life in Tenmile.

Surviving are a daughter, Mrs. Vest Gauntlett, Gold Beach; three sisters, Mrs. Sally McClung, Roseburg; Miss Lydia McCulloch and Mrs. Emily Bailey, both of Long Beach, Calif.; a brother, James, Myrtle Point, and two grandchildren.

Graveside funeral services will be held Sunday at 2 p.m. at the Tenmile cemetery, with Dr. Morris Roach officiating. Long & Orr mortuary is in charge of arrangements.
