Oregon Draws Nearly \$100,000 On Polio Fund
The emergency fund of the National Foundation for Infantile Paralysis has poured near \$100,000 in to Oregon in 1951.
Gene Malecki of Portland, Oregon representative for the March of Dimes organization, said today that Foundation advances to strapped chapters in the state this year total \$89,275.
Clackamas county received the largest amount, \$37,200 and Washington county next with \$17,800. Other counties helped, and their totals were Columbia, \$15,900; Malheur, \$5,600; Polk, \$5,050; Deschutes, \$4,950; Marion, \$3,125; Josephine, \$3,000; Clatsop, \$1,900; Tillamook, \$1,450, and Linn, \$1,300.
"This is the fourth consecutive year Oregon has had an average of more than 300 cases, and the accumulation of carry-over cases has become a staggering burden," Malecki said.

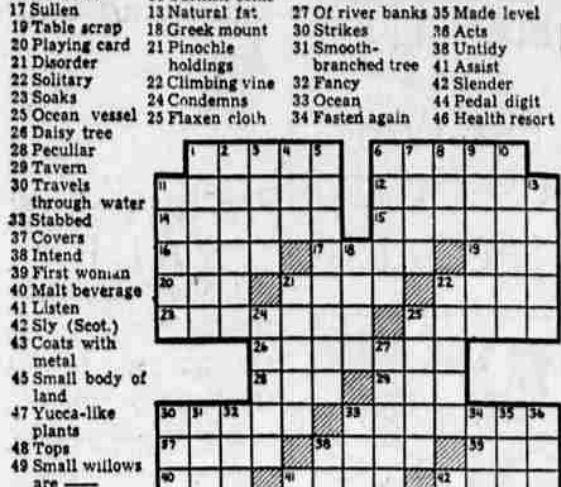

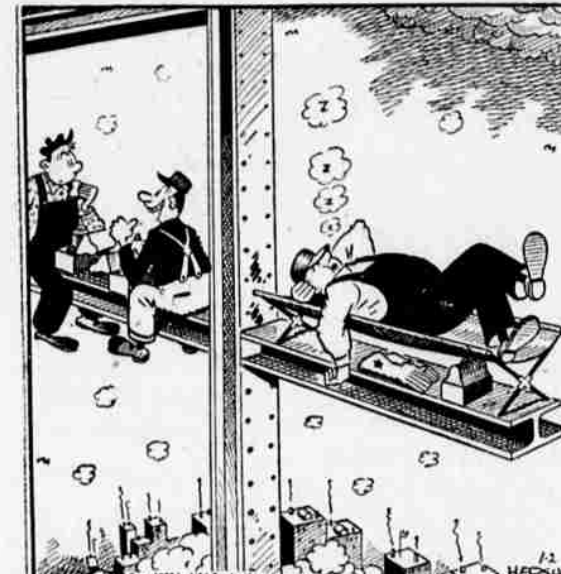
