Sen. Morse Refuses To Accept Yule Gift

WASHINGTON (AP) — Sen. Morse (R-Ore.) said Monday he is sending back a \$500 sterling silver tray and goblet set that an Oregon man sent to him as a Christmas present.

Morse declined to name the man who sent him the gift, but said he is the head of an Oregon firm which has benefited by some of Morse's activities in behalf of Oregon.

"I am sure this was sent in good faith, but this is the kind of thing that we must put a stop to," Morse told a reporter. He said he does not believe any senator should receive a gift for "doing the kind of work he is supposed to do in his job as senator."

Demos' Finance Chairman Quits

PORTLAND (AP) — Abe G. Gilbert, who startled Democrats last month with his plan to raise funds for the 1952 campaign, has resigned as chairman of the Oregon Democrats' Finance Committee.

The resignation was the outgrowth of a dispute at a meeting of the Central Committee last month when Gilbert was quoted as saying businessmen should be solicited for party contributions in return for consideration from the administration.

Gilbert, a Portland furniture dealer, said the quotation, taken out of context, created the wrong impression.

At the same meeting Gilbert criticized National Committeeman Monroe Sweetland. He said differences with Sweetland and other Democratic leaders, made his job impossible.

William Josslin, Central Committee chairman, announced the resignation. No successor has been chosen.

DOUBLE HARD LUCK

SPOKANE (AP) — Leonard Gottschalk admitted in court Monday he didn't have a federal stamp when he shot at a duck last November.

"Bad shot, eh?" said Federal Judge Sam Driver. "That makes the offense even worse. The fine is \$25."

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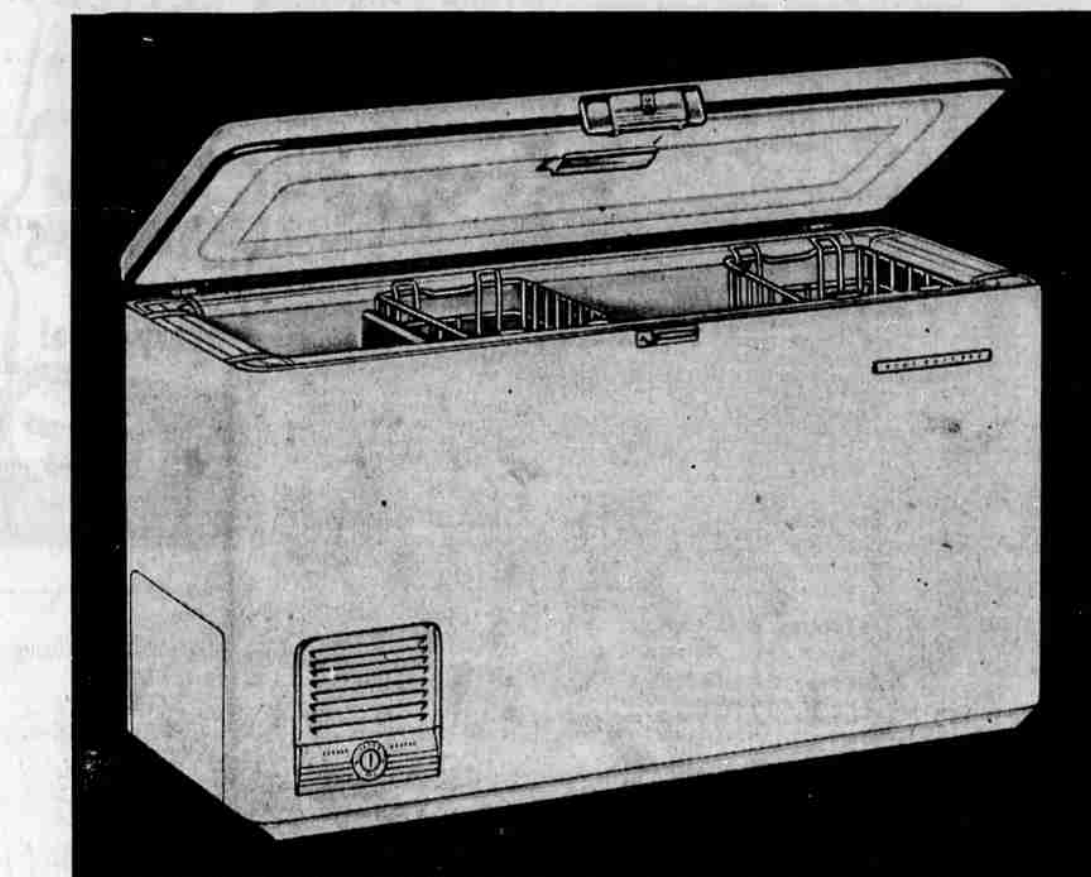

Flourine Fumes Base \$350,000 Damage Suit

PORTLAND (AP) — The Paul Martin family filed a \$350,000 damage suit in Federal Court Monday, contending they were poisoned by fumes from an aluminum plant.

The Martins—Paul, his wife Verla and their daughter Paula—said winds blew fluorine fumes from the Troutdale, Ore., Reynolds Metals Plant onto their farm between November, 1946 and November, 1950. The suit said they now must live in Arizona for their health.

The Reynolds Metals Company recently was ordered to pay \$78,000 for damage which the fumes caused to livestock and crops in the area. Similar suits asking two million dollars were dismissed.

U.S. Grand Juries Called For Probe

WASHINGTON (AP) — U.S. district attorneys throughout the nation mapped plans Monday for the convening of special grand juries to investigate "racketeers, gangsters and organized crime."

Attorney General McGrath sent out orders over the week-end for the calling of special grand juries in each of the 93 Federal judicial districts "as soon as possible."

McGrath specifically directed that underworld figures be brought in for questioning.

Some observers viewed McGrath's move as another step by the administration to take political ammunition away from its critics.

It came at a time when some critics were saying McGrath has not been vigorous enough in dealing with corruption in government.

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
