Stassen Says Campaign Not Shadow For Ike

MILWAUKEE — Harold E. Stassen said Tuesday his bid for the republican presidential nomination would be on his own and not "a shadow campaign for Gen. Eisenhower."

Stassen told a press conference that Eisenhower's statement that he would be available if drafted for the nomination "clears the air."

"I believe that the rightness of my decision to run and enter most of these primaries is borne out by Gen. Eisenhower's statement. My campaign for nomination and election will proceed."

Tariff Boost Sought For Imported Tuna

WASHINGTON — A West Coast congressman proposed a slow down Monday on imports of brine-packed tuna.

Rep. Mack (R-Wash.) told reporters he has prepared a bill to increase the duty on the product from 12 1/2 to 45 per cent.

Imports—primarily from Japan—increased from 3,779 cases in all of 1949 to 204,341 cases in the month of September, 1951, he said.

"This increase threatens to cause vast unemployment among the 23,000 cannery workers and fishermen employed by the Pacific Coast 112 million dollar tuna industry," Mack declared.

Oregon Backers Of Ike To Confer With Sen. Lodge

SALEM — The "Oregon for Eisenhower" Committee decided Tuesday to confer next week in San Francisco with Sen. Lodge (R-Mass.) before announcing its strategy in conducting its campaign to win the votes of Oregon's 18 Republican delegates for General Eisenhower.

The committee met Tuesday morning. It has more than the required 1,000 signatures on petitions to enter the general in Oregon's May 16 Republican Presidential primary.

The general already is entered as a Democratic candidate in Oregon, but Monroe Sweetland, Portland, Democratic national committeeman and Truman supporter, threatens a court suit to take Eisenhower's name off the Democratic ballot because Eisenhower is a Republican.

The Republican National Committee has called a meeting in San Francisco for Jan. 17 and 18 to which western Republican leaders are invited.

More Names Wanted
William L. Phillips, Salem, chairman of the "Oregon for Eisenhower" Committee, and Rep. Mark Hatfield, secretary, will attend the meeting. They will confer with Sen. Lodge and other leaders of the national Eisenhower campaign.

Japanese Protest Tuna Import Hike By U. S.

TOKYO — Seven hundred representatives of Japan's tuna fishermen, packers, exporters and seamen signed a petition Wednesday protesting proposed new U.S. import duties on raw and frozen tuna.

Kyodo News Service said the petition also asked reduction of U.S. duties on canned and oiled tuna and pegging of duties on canned and salted tuna at the present level.

When asked to comment in Sweetland's plan to sue to keep Eisenhower's name off the Democratic ballot, both Phillips and Hatfield said they don't care if Eisenhower's name is on the Democratic ballot, too.

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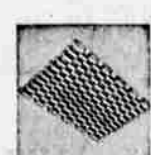
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
