\$24 Million Judgment Hits Utilities Chief

NEW YORK (AP) — A federal court judgment amounting to 24 million dollars was handed down Thursday against Harrison Williams, who built a fabulous fortune in the 1920's.
Federal Judge Edward Weinfeld ruled that the utilities executive owed 12 million dollars, plus interest since 1927, to trustees of the Central States Electric Corporation of Richmond, Va. The interest would double the 12 million dollars.
