The passenger service will end because the SP&S says it has been a money-losing affair. Freight service will continue.

Chrysler Asks Higher Auto Price Ceilings

WASHINGTON — The Chrysler Corporation applied to the government Thursday for higher factory wholesale ceiling prices for its four makes of cars. The increases, asked by Chrysler under the Caperhart Amendment to the Economic Controls Law, would range from \$3 to \$88. The Caperhart Amendment requires the Office of Price Stabilization to allow manufacturers to use their pre-Korean prices and add all cost increases through last July 26, in figuring new ceilings.

More Sheep, Lambs Fed In U.S. Than Year Ago

WASHINGTON — The Agriculture Department reported Thursday that farmers are feeding 15 per cent more sheep and lambs for the slaughter market than a year ago. The number was estimated at 3,884,000 on Jan. 1. This is the first year since 1945, the department said, that there has been an increase in feeding operations over the previous year. The number of feed nevertheless is still 45 per cent below the recent peak of 6,954,000 in 1943.
