**Here's How To Figure Correct Spray Amounts**

If a weed spray recommendation calls for 10 gallons of material per acre, how do you know if you are applying the correct amount?  
Chances are good you don't, says E. M. Nelson, Wasco County extension agent, and that may be the reason for poor results.  
Here's Nelson's solution to the problem. Set the spray outfit's pressure regulator at the required pressure with all nozzles operating. Use clear water. Set the tractor or throttle at the proper spraying speed and spray a measured 40 rods.  
Measure the amount of water used and multiply this number in gallons by 66 and divide the figure by the number of feet in the spray swath. The result will be the gallons per acre applied at the particular throttle and pressure setting. For example, if the amount sprayed while traveling the 40 rods is 5 gallons, multiply 5 by 66 which will give 330. Then, if the spray swath is 27 feet, divide 330 by 27. Thus, the sprayer is applying 12.2 gallons per acre. Forty rods, incidentally, is 660 feet.

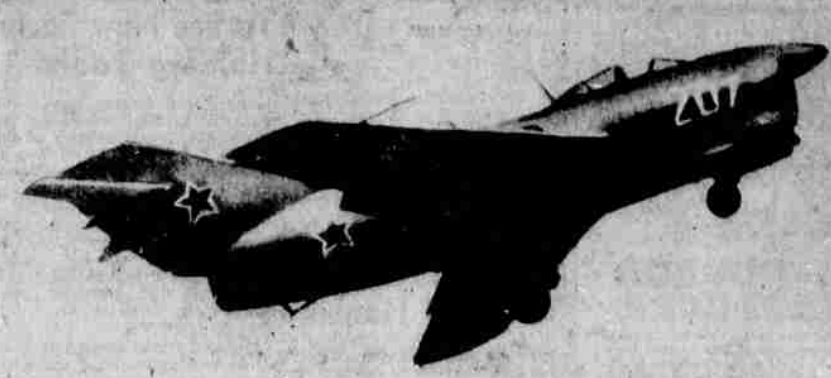

**U. S. Weapons Output To Top Russia, Claim**

WASHINGTON — Secretary of Defense Lovett told Senators Thursday this country soon should be out-producing Soviet Russia in fast jet fighter aircraft, modern tanks and other critical weapons. Chairman Russell (D-Ga.) of the Senate Armed Services Committee,

who heard Lovett testify at a closed door session, said plans for the combined Armed Forces by June 30, 1953 will be less than 3,800,000 men and women.  
Some congressmen had expected it to reach four million, an increase of about 500,000.  
In general, Russell said Lovett "is optimistic" that bottle necks in present production of planes, tanks and other weapons will be broken.
