Demo Solon Scores "Trend To Socialism"

BALTIMORE (AP) — Sen. Herbert R. O'Connor D-Md., said Monday night he was leaving public office this year "to be free to speak frankly and bluntly... without appearing to be ungrateful to any party or supporters."
And in the seven-minute address over a Baltimore television station he criticized what he said were:
1. "The trend toward socialism... it is stronger than ever."
2. "The idea of security through government handouts."
3. "Government intervention into the daily lives of its citizens, and government usurpation of economic activities."
He did not mention the national administration by name. He referred only to the "government."

State Labor Federation To Offer Scholarships

PORTLAND (AP) — The Oregon State Federation of Labor will present \$500 college scholarships to five high school students.
Winners will be selected from those placing highest in a test on history of the labor movement, union officials announced Monday. High school principals will be notified of details of the scholarships.

Crew Of Lost Vessel Still Sought From Air

SEATTLE (AP) — Nineteen planes took off Tuesday in the biggest air search in the history of North Pacific shipping.
They sought clues to the missing freighter Pennsylvania and the 45 or 46 man crew that abandoned her—or tried to—in stormy seas last Wednesday.
"If they got away from the ship in lifeboats they have a 50-50 chance," Capt. Allen Winbeck, Coast Guard district operations officer, said Monday.
However, the captain of a Japanese freighter which was in the area when the Pennsylvania sent its SOS, said at Portland, Ore., it is doubtful there are any survivors.
"The weather was very bad," said Capt. H. Maeda of the Kamakura Maru. "The seas were very large and the wind was blowing 40 knots."

Soldiers Co-Operate In Spiritual Drive

FORT MONMOUTH, N. J. (AP) — "Stand up; stand up for Jesus!" The words of the militant Christians' old song rang out from hundreds of soldiers' throats here Monday night and reverberated among the steel girders.
A choir, seated in the bleachers of the big fieldhouse, joined in. And thus began a five-day series of religious services—one of the first moves in a major drive de-

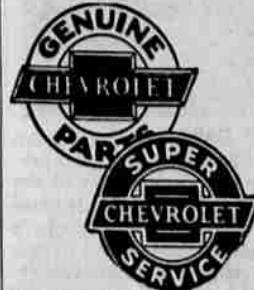
veloping throughout the country to bolster the serviceman's spiritual defense.

It is a campaign sponsored by the General Commission on Chaplains and the National Council of Churches—to convince him that "Christ is the answer," theme of the preaching mission.
Civilian teams of Protestant ministers are carrying the Gospel to guardhouse and to hospital counseling and preaching. Some 120 Navy and Army installations will be reached in the two-month crusade.
