2. Accepting advertisements on the

The Journal company was specifi-
cally charged in a suit, filed by
the Justice Department last
May, with refusing to accept ads
from persons who also advertised
over Mansfield Radio Station
WMAN, described in the record as
"the sole competitor of the News
Journal in Mansfield."

The department noted that the
consent decree at Mansfield fol-
lowed the action of the Supreme
Court on December 11 in unani-
mously affirming an anti-trust
judgment against the Lorain (Ohio)
Journal company, which is under
the same ownership as the Mans-
field newspaper.

WASHINGTON - The justice
department said Tuesday a civil
anti-trust suit against the Mans-
field (Ohio) News-Journal has
been ended with acceptance by the
newspaper of a judgment regulat-
ing its advertising policies.

Attorney General McGrath said
the judgment, a consent decree,
was entered in the federal district
court at Cleveland.

The department said that it en-
joins the publishing company and
its principal offices and executives from:

1. Refusing to accept advertise-
ments where the reason for re-
fusal is that the advertiser uses
or proposes to use another adver-
