lowed to become expendable again as they were in the last war," declared T. J. Kauer, Ohio's highway director.

"During World War II," he said, "it became patriotic for truckers to pile unprecendented loads on their vehicles to keep the materials of war flowing.

"The result was that our roads, never built to carry such weight, came out of the conflict literally broken to pieces."

Kauer made his statement as chairman of an 11-state inter regional Council on Highway Transportation meeting here concur-

rently with a four-day session of the Highway Research Board. The 900 traffic engineers, technicians and road officials are dealing with highway construction, maintenance and traffic problems. The board operates under the National Academy of Sciences.

Kauer recommended an 18,000-pound axle limit for U.S. roads—the same limit suggested by the American Association of State Highway Officials.

Democrat Win Needs 'Fair Deal' Man, Solon Says

WASHINGTON (AP)—Sen. Humphrey (D-Minn.) said Wednesday the Democrats can't win the presidential election unless they nominate a "consistent 'fair dealer' and a warm supporter of the administration's foreign policy."

The Minnesota lawmaker told a reporter President Truman would fill the bill "better than anyone else because I obviously am talking about the kind of program for which he has fought."

But Humphrey added: "We have other good Democrats who could qualify and win the election" if Mr. Truman decides not to seek another term.

Sen. Capehart (R-Ind.) said he believes the President will run again.

"The Democrats in my opinion haven't anyone else who could even make a race of it and I think Mr. Truman knows that," Capehart declared.

Capehart is backing Sen. Taft of Ohio for the Republican Presidential Nomination. But he said he is convinced "any Republican nominated can win this year."

Humphrey conferred with the President Monday and said afterward that Mr. Truman had kept him guessing on his plans.

Humphrey reported, however, that Mr. Truman had told him he "wants a liberal platform, a liberal party and a liberal candidate."

Truman To Ask Huge Tax Boost, Senator States

WASHINGTON (AP)—Sen. Robertson (D-Va.) predicted Tuesday that President Truman will ask Congress for "10 billion or more" in new taxes to balance the budget in the next fiscal year.

He made the statement at a meeting of the Senate-House Committee on Defense Production which heard Secretary of Commerce Charles Sawyer testify on the impact of the mobilization program on business.

Sawyer predicted a "substantial increase" in unemployment in the April-June quarter but said he believes the overall situation won't be serious.

Robertson's comment came after Sawyer had told the committee he did not think the defense program could be judged solely by the amount of money now being spent for military equipment.

"The President evidently thinks we are going to spend lots more money when he submits the budget next week because he's going to ask for 10 billion or more in taxes," Robertson commented.

Congressman Seeks Ouster Of McGrath

WASHINGTON (AP)—Rep. Curtis R. (Mo.) said Friday he intends to institute proceedings for removal of Attorney General J. Howard McGrath.

In a statement, Curtis characterized as "shocking news" the announcement by President Truman that he was turning over to McGrath the responsibility for clean-

ing up any corruption in the government.

Curtis said it was "utter collapse" of the Justice Department law enforcement agency, headed by McGrath, that "is responsible for the sickening picture of graft and corruption."
