New Baseball Wage Ruling May Hurt Winning Giants

WASHINGTMN A — The New York Giants, National League pennant winners, may get hurt by a new government ruling on baseball salaries, a Major League club official predicts.

Pennant winners usually boost salaries sharply the following year. The new ruling doesn't cover this and the Giants apparently will not be able to spend more than in 1951.

"Il'Il hurt the Giants unless they can get released as a special case from the Salary Board," Calvin Griffith, vice president of the Washington Senators, told a reporter.

The new policy announced Wednesday night set a ceiling on club payrolls rather than salaries
